Statement from Robert and Rhonda McGregor

We Robert Peter McGregor and Rhonda Daphne McGregor are the registered proprietors of the property "Tarrawonga" Boggabri. Under a Lease dated 14 March 2005 we leased to Whitehaven Coal Mining Limited part of such property consisting of Lot 3 DP 1131282 for use as a transport route for a period commencing 7 March 2005 and terminating on 6 March 2015. Under the terms of the Lease which was drafted by the solicitor for Whitehaven Coal Mining Limited and was executed by Whitehaven Coal Mining Limited the lessee is not permitted to assign, transfer, sublet or part with possession of the land the subject of the lease. Under the Lease the land is to be used only as a transport route. It is stated in the Lease that such transport route is to be for the East Boggabri Coal Mine (now known as the Tarrawonga Mine). It is also stated in the lease that the road is a private mine access road. It is further stated in the Lease that the road shall be appropriately sign posted at both ends with reflective signage, and gates will be constructed, or other agreed precautions installed, at each point where the road intersects a public road to protect its private status.

We note that on 14 December 2012 Mr Tim Muldoon the Manager Community Relations of Whitehaven Coal Limited sent to a number of parties an email stating that Whitehaven had been requested by the landowners of two private sections of the Tarrawonga Haul road to stop any vehicle from utilising the road that is not attending or departing Tarrawonga Mine. We emphasise that what we are attempting to do is simply make sure that Whitehaven Coal Mining Limited as lessee complies with its obligations under the terms of the Lease dated 14 March 2005 which Lease was prepared by the solicitor for Whitehaven Coal Mining Limited and executed by Whitehaven Coal Mining Limited.
