# 7. Notification of Items of General Business Proposed to be Raised:

Question by Ms Therese Folpp: There might be a need to review the declaration of pecuniary interest as there are new guidelines.

Ms Julie Thomas: We will review the new guidelines to see if any amendment is required.

#### 8. Reports

Environmental Monitoring Data & Operations — Julie Thomas presented a PowerPoint presentation to the committee. The presentation contained an update on approvals, mine operations, project, rehabilitation, complaints and the results of the environmental monitoring data (weather, dust, gas, water, blasting and noise), at the mine site.

### Mining Update

- Rehabilitation in Open Cut 2 is continuing with final composting and seeding. This is expected to be completed by the end of year.
- Spontaneous combustion management continues in Open Cut 1.
- Rehabilitation in Open Cut 1 has continued. Thiess Rehabilitation are completing this work. Mr. Peter York is here today to represent Thiess.
- In April 2022, MCC submitted an application to MSC to make minor amendments to the
  development consent to assist in the transition from mining into a closure execution
  phase and ultimately lease relinquishment. MCC are still in talks with MSC and discussions
  around this modification are ongoing.
- MCC has undertaken contamination studies at the old brickworks.

### **Project Update**

- Exploration Licence A176 Update Idemitsu Australia is working with the Resource Regulator to finalise the relinquishment of Exploration Licence A176.
- Idemitsu Australia has received approval from the Resource Regulator to relinquish ML1513 Sandy Creek Lease.
- MCC has received approval from MSC to conduct remediation works at the Old Pit Top development. This work will be undertaken during 2024.
- Pumped Hydro Update Idemitsu are now developing the pumped hydro project in partnership with AGL. Development activities including site surveys, geotechnical drilling, and environmental studies will be ongoing until 2025.
- Solar Farm Update Development of solar farm is ongoing, with the project currently focussed on responding to feedback as part of the EIS approval process. Solar farm development is now expected to continue until end of 2024.
- NSW Mining's mining responsibly for today and tomorrow's new campaign video featuring the Muswellbrook Coal site was shown to the committee.

#### **Environmental Management Plan Update**

- MCC has a requirement to update the Environmental Management Plans at the end of mining activities.
- All MCC Environmental Management Plans have been reviewed and updated.
- The required consultation was undertaken. The only comment received were from DPE-Water on the Water Management Plan
- MSC are currently assessing these updates with this work to be completed after the

finalisation of the consent modification.

# West Muswellbrook Project

No update

#### MCC Mine Closure

- Mine closure activities focusing on the requirements for lease relinquishment are ongoing.
- In parallel with this work, alternate post mining land use studies are ongoing this includes Pumped Hydro and a Solar Farm.
- MCC are working with Transport NSW on interactions between MCC activities and the Muswellbrook Bypass. An application to modify MCC's consent to remove the bypass area from the consent footprint has been submitted to MSC. This will be assessed as part of the consent modification MSC are currently assessing.
- Hunter Gas Pipeline passes through MCC land. Discussions are being held with Santos regarding interactions.

#### Weather

- Wind Roses: for September, October and November were presented. Predominantly South Easterly Winds with a shift in October and November.
- Rainfall: Lower than average rainfall. Drier than average since May 2023.

#### **Dust**

•  $PM_{10}$ : All within range, no exceedance to discuss.

#### **Gas Monitoring**

Gas monitor results from Muscle Creek, were presented to the CCC. All results were within
the realm of where we expect them to be. Full results are available on the company
website.

#### Water

- Ground Water Sampling shows still within acceptable levels. Not a lot of change.
- Surface Water Monitoring remains constant. Changes to frequency. Slight change in electrical conductivity due to dry conditions and low water levels.

# **Complaints**

 The complaint history until November 2023 was presented to the CCC. MCC received a total of 4 complaints in 2023. Three complaints were relating to spontaneous combustion (odour) and one complaint related to road haulage.

Question by Mr Malcolm Ogg: What was the nature of the road haulage complaint? Ms Julie Thomas: It was in relation to damage to a person/s headlight from a rock which has fallen from an oncoming haulage truck.

## <u>Upper Hunter Mining Dialogue</u>

 Cate Sims from Upper Hunter Mining Dialogue presented a PowerPoint presentation to the committee. The presentation contained an overview of the dialogue, key project and ongoing benefits, 2022 forum feedback and 2023 plan, communications and engagement, annual reporting, water usage project and 2023 School Mine Tours Program.

*Mr Peter York:* Yes. I will prepare a presentation for the next CCC. So far, we have been mobilising and recruiting additional staff. We have had some staff from other sites such as Mt Owen come over to MCC. The scope of work has included managing carbonaceous material and dozer pushing this down into the pit, we have been managing spontaneous combustion and will be blasting sometime this week on the highwall. We will finalise drainage and the design of the drop structure. Julie is overlooking the approvals and liaising with the Resource Regulator.

Question by Mr Garry Chapman: How many people do you have to answer to? Mr Peter York: The whole community, both parties (Thiess and MCC) want the best outcome for the site.

Question by Ms Theresa Folpp: Will there be much blasting on the highwall?

Mr Peter York: Only small blasts, 6-8 in total.

Mr Brett O'Kane: Blasting is scheduled to be complete by March 2024.

Question by Mr Malcolm Ogg: Will contaminated material impact water?

Ms Julie Thomas: It is not expected to, but it is something that is part of the mine closure studies to confirm.

Question by Ms Theresa Folpp: Has recruitment of workers from other sites put a strain on other sites?

*Mr Peter York:* Not at this stage. Thiess are recruiting for experienced dozer operators and maintenance personnel.

Question by Ms Theresa Folpp: Are you sharing equipment between sites?

*Mr Pete York:* All the gear is here. We are using and maintaining MCC equipment and will bring in extra equipment as required such as a drill for blasting activities.
