8. Reports

- A. Environmental Monitoring Data & Operations Ms Julie Thomas presented a PowerPoint presentation to the committee. The presentation contained an update on approvals, mine operations, rehabilitation, complaints and the results of the environmental monitoring data (weather, dust, water, blasting and noise), for the previous two quarters (January June 2016) at the mine site.
- B. Report Discussion -

Mining Update

- i. Mining activities continued in Open Cut 1 with some material being dumped in Open Cut 2.
- ii. 850,000 tonnes of coal was mined and 3.86 million cubic metres of waste was removed during the reporting period.
- iii. 499 hours was lost due to environmental conditions.

W. Muswellbrook Project

 Recent drilling programs and installation of groundwater piezometers is complete.

Sandy Creek Project

Continuation Project

- Statement of Environment Effects (SEE) submitted to Muswellbrook Shire Council (MSC) on 29th April 2016
- A newsletter was distributed in early May 2016 to surrounding neighbours.
- Community and regulators have provided submissions in relation to the project.
- MCC have reviewed these submissions and have provided a response to submissions to MSC.
- MCC and MSC are discussing these submissions and draft consent conditions.

<u>Weather</u>

- i. Windroses: Primarily south-easterly wind directions during the first reporting period, January, February and March which is consistent with seasonal expectations. For the following period, from April, May and June, wind directions were primarily from the north-north-westerly which is again, consistent with seasonal expectations.
- ii. Rain: Above average precipitation in January, June and July.

Dust

- i. Dust Deposition: Average levels at all sites were within the compliance levels.
- ii. TSP (Total Suspended Particulates): All sites below criteria.
- iii. PM₁₀: Majority below criteria.
 - Mr. Ray Butchard queried anomalous spikes in three (3) TSP (Quarry) readings. MCC unable to present history for the anomalies at the time of the question. No further discussion or action.

Water

i. Quality of surface water is influenced by natural conditions. Ground water has decreased in pH & EC due to the increased rainfall. Underground water levels also consistent and stable.

Blasting

 There were 60 blast events conducted at MCC Open Cut Operations between 1st January and 30th June 2016. All results for the reporting period were below criteria.

Complaints

i. The complaint history until July 2016 was presented to the CCC. There was a general discussion around the types of complaints. These were mainly odour complaints.

9. CCC Membership

MCC have been discussing with MSC the option to revisit the CCC membership. It has been ~5 years since the membership was reviewed and with the upcoming Council elections and modification to the approval, MCC and MSC feel that now would be a good time to revisit the membership and allow an opportunity for new members to join the CCC. The MSC guidelines allow for up to 5 community members and there are currently 3 community members on the committee. All existing members are encouraged to reapply for roles on the CCC if they wish to remain involved with the CCC.
