Proponent's Report

Correspondence

AW stepped the Committee through the list of correspondence, highlighting the more significant matters:

- **NSW Department of Planning Housing and infrastructure (DPHI)**

AW advised that a community complaint received by DPHI regarding consultation of the Heritage Management Plan and salvage program at BC54. Information on the complaint was provided with the matter closed out and no further action taken.

An exceedance at the 'Glenhope' HVAS was reported to DPHI – this was not caused by BCO operations.

AW advised that the BTM Water Management Strategy had been approved and an inspection of the BC54 cultural heritage site had been undertaken by representatives of the DPHI and the Office of Environment and Heritage (NSW) in association with the Registered Aboriginal Parties (RAPs).

- **Environment Protection Authority (EPA)**

AW advised BCO has provided EPA with the requested audit of blast monitors following the warning letter and penalty notice issued in respect of the overpressure exceedance (blast) that occurred on 18 January 2025. No response has been received at this point.

- **Biodiversity Conservation Trust**

AW advised that the annual inspection of Conservation Agreement areas was completed in November and December 2025.

- **National Parks**

AW noted that the land transfer for handover of Mallee, Merriendi and Myall Plains is being finalised.

- **Forestry Corporation of NSW**

AW advised that the compensation agreement for A355 is being drafted by Forestry.

- **Department of Climate Change, Energy, Environment and Water (Federal)**

AW advised that DCCEEW conducted a site visit and audit of EPBC conditions in November 2025. The BTM Water Management Strategy has been approved.

- **Narrabri Shire Council**

AW indicated that discussions regarding housing continue with Council with a meeting scheduled in the coming

week. EOH enquired whether it is still proposed to establish a duplex development to accommodate doctors. AW indicated this is the focus, and it will be constructed on a BCO owned lot in Boggabri.

Operational Update

Production Targets

It was noted that 7.2 million tonnes of coal was mined in 2025, with 6.8 million tonnes railed.

AW then outlined the key projects for 2026:

- Finalise edge of pit maintenance and fuel facility.
- Expansion of workshop and warehouse.
- Vanadium battery construction
- Doctor's housing construction in Boggabri.

Modification 10 update

AW advised that the response to submissions report was submitted to the DPHI on 27 October 2025. Requests for further information from government agencies is being assessed. The modification will not be referred to the Independent Planning Commission, with determination to be made by the Minister or his delegate.

Housing Voluntary Planning Agreement Update

AW indicated that in principle agreement has been reached with Narrabri Shire Council regarding housing for doctors in Boggabri.

Environmental Monitoring

Water

The Committee noted the surface and groundwater tables and the rainfall graph. RD enquired whether there will be a need to extract more groundwater. AW responded that there will be a need to draw on groundwater and this will comply with the relevant water licences.

RD sought confirmation of the status of the 'old' dam (MW5) – is it dry? AW confirmed that all water has been transferred from the MW5 and the new dam, MW11, is in place.

Noise Monitoring

The Committee noted the map and tables associated with noise monitoring.


Air Quality Monitoring

The Committee noted the air quality monitoring tables. AW highlighted the various exceedances during 2025, in particular the exceedance at the 'Glenhope' HVAS PM10 monitor on 16 December 2025 which was not caused by

	<p>Boggabri Coal Operations.</p> <p>2025 HV tyre disposal It was noted that 347 tyres had been disposed of in-pit YTD.</p> <p>AW advised that tyre recycling is ongoing and will continue for another year. It was noted that during 2025, 18 tyres were recycled in May, 7 tyres recycled in August, and 31 tyres recycled in October.</p> <p>EOH commented that Narrabri Shire Council is examining options to establish a HV tyre recycling plant in the region. RD enquired when will a report on the tyre recycling trial be available. AW advised in 2027.</p> <p>Exploration 2025 The Committee reviewed the exploration map in the presentation. AW advised that the exploration process is ongoing and will continue in 2026. RD question whether the blue/green area on the map is subject to clearing. ST responded that there have been some minor changes to the areas subject to clearing – the large square to the west of the dam will not be cleared. ST drew attention to the 2026 Tree Clearing map in the presentation which highlights the area in yellow to be cleared for pit progression, an area of 23.81 hectares.</p> <p>Community Complaints The Committee noted the complaints’ bar chart and the complaint in November 2025.</p> <p>Sponsorship 2025 It was noted that \$298,863.20 had been committed in sponsorship to organisations or events during 2025.</p> <p>Current Vacancies The Committee noted the current list of vacancies.</p>

9.	<p>General Business</p> <p>9.1 Koala Tree Troughs (Blinky Drinkers) RD enquired whether tree troughs for koala are still installed. AW advised that they are still out there and in operation. AW advised that DPFI had undertaken assessment work in the offsets of koala numbers – no results are available yet. With Forestry NSW’s permission a consultancy completed a drone survey recently to assess koala presence in Leard State Forest.</p> <p>9.2 Indigenous Discussions EOH sought clarification on recent discussions with the Aboriginal community – does it relate to Native Title. AW advised</p>	

	<p>there is no Native Title on the lease where BC54 is located. The discussions relate to the Heritage Management Plan and the level of salvage of cultural artifacts on CL368.</p> <p>9.3 Transitioning Off EOH noted that Boggabri Coal Mine is scheduled to close in 2036 or 2040 if a modification for extension is approved – she questioned what happens after the mine closes and the impact on the community? What will be the impact on individuals and business. She noted work being done by the Hunter Alliance regarding mining closure in the Hunter Valley. MJS commented that he would be discussing the implications of mine closure with both Narrabri and Gunnedah Councils. AW noted there is a closure plan assessment being conducted this year by IA.</p> <p>9.4 Dust Monitoring EOH commented on the need for improved air monitoring in relation to blasting and potential impacts on groundwater. She made mention of the inadequacy of primarily recording PM10 over PM2.5 and there being little assessment of the presence of nitrogen oxides. AW noted the recent environmental monitoring developments associated with the Cadia mine. EOH indicated the community is examining portable air monitors manufactured by <i>PurpleAir</i> that measure PM2.5 particulate and provide real time data.</p> <p><i>Chair’s note: The NSW EPA reports that an Enforceable Undertaking (EU) with Cadia Holdings Pty Ltd will see Cadia provide support funding for the construction of five new permanent dust monitoring stations to boost the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water’s Rural Dust Monitoring Network. The commitment will allow for new DustTrak™ monitors to be installed, which will measure PM10, PM2.5, visibility, oxides of nitrogen and ozone, and increase the dust monitoring network to more than 40 monitors statewide.</i></p> <p>Meeting closed 10.02 am</p>

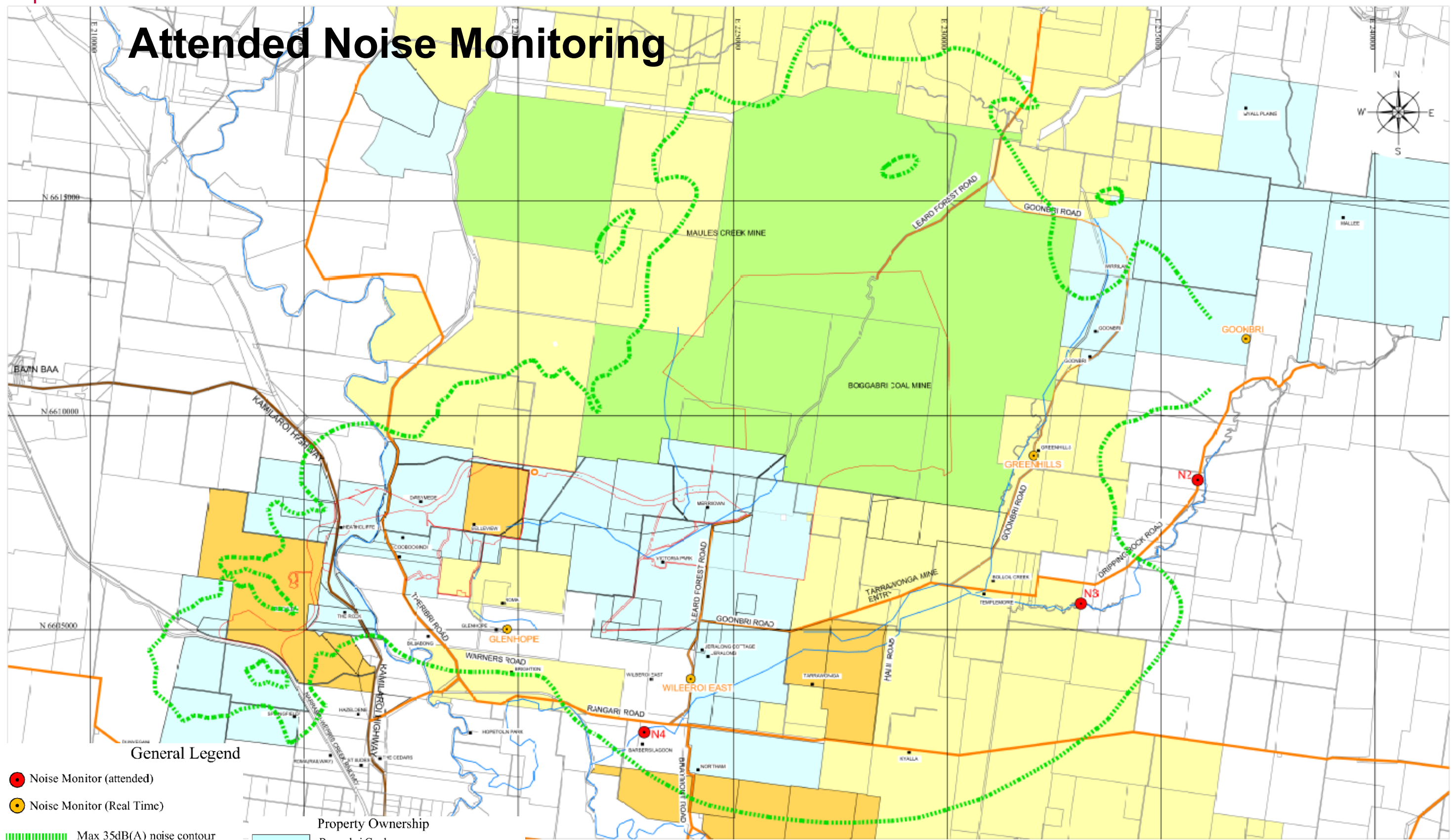

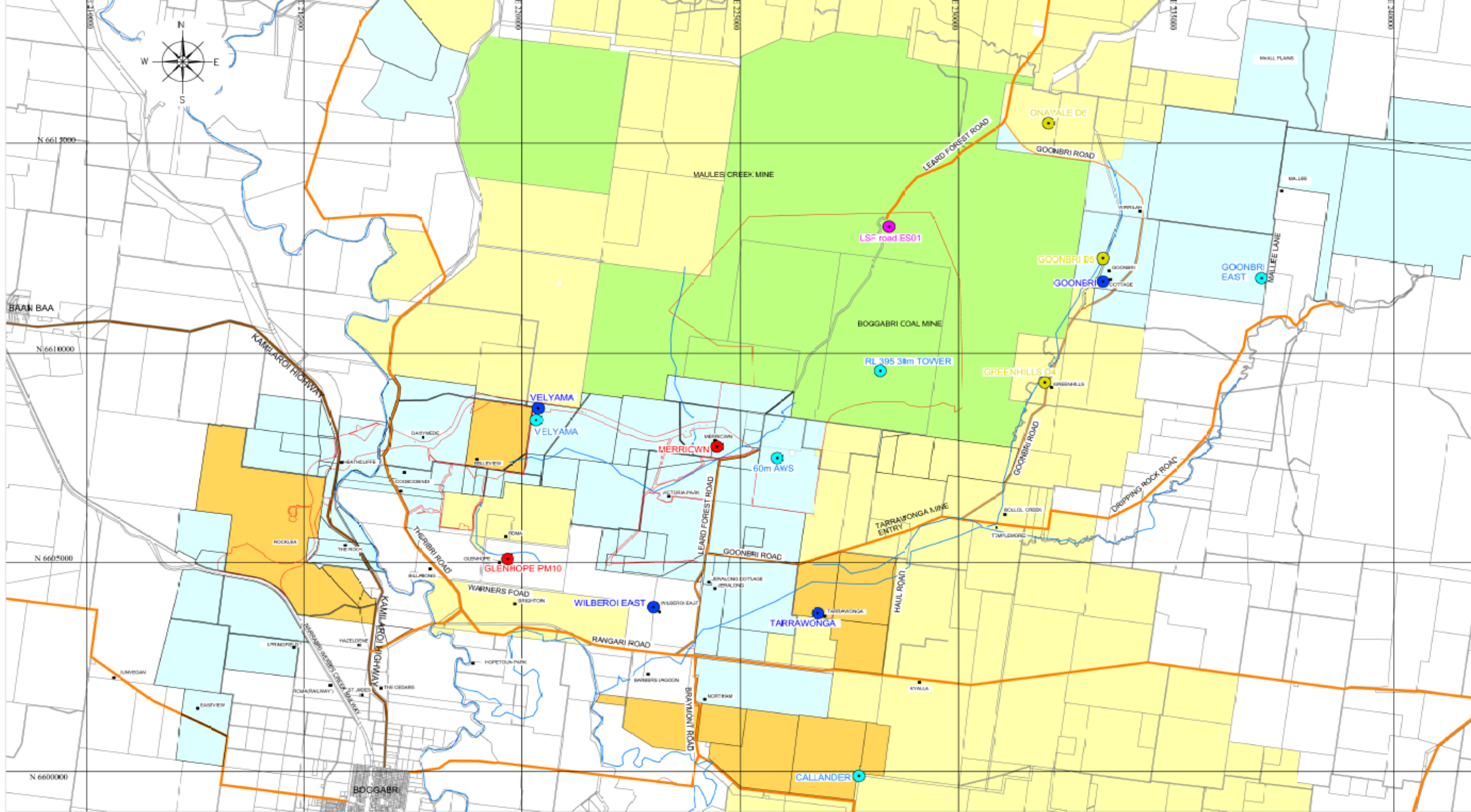

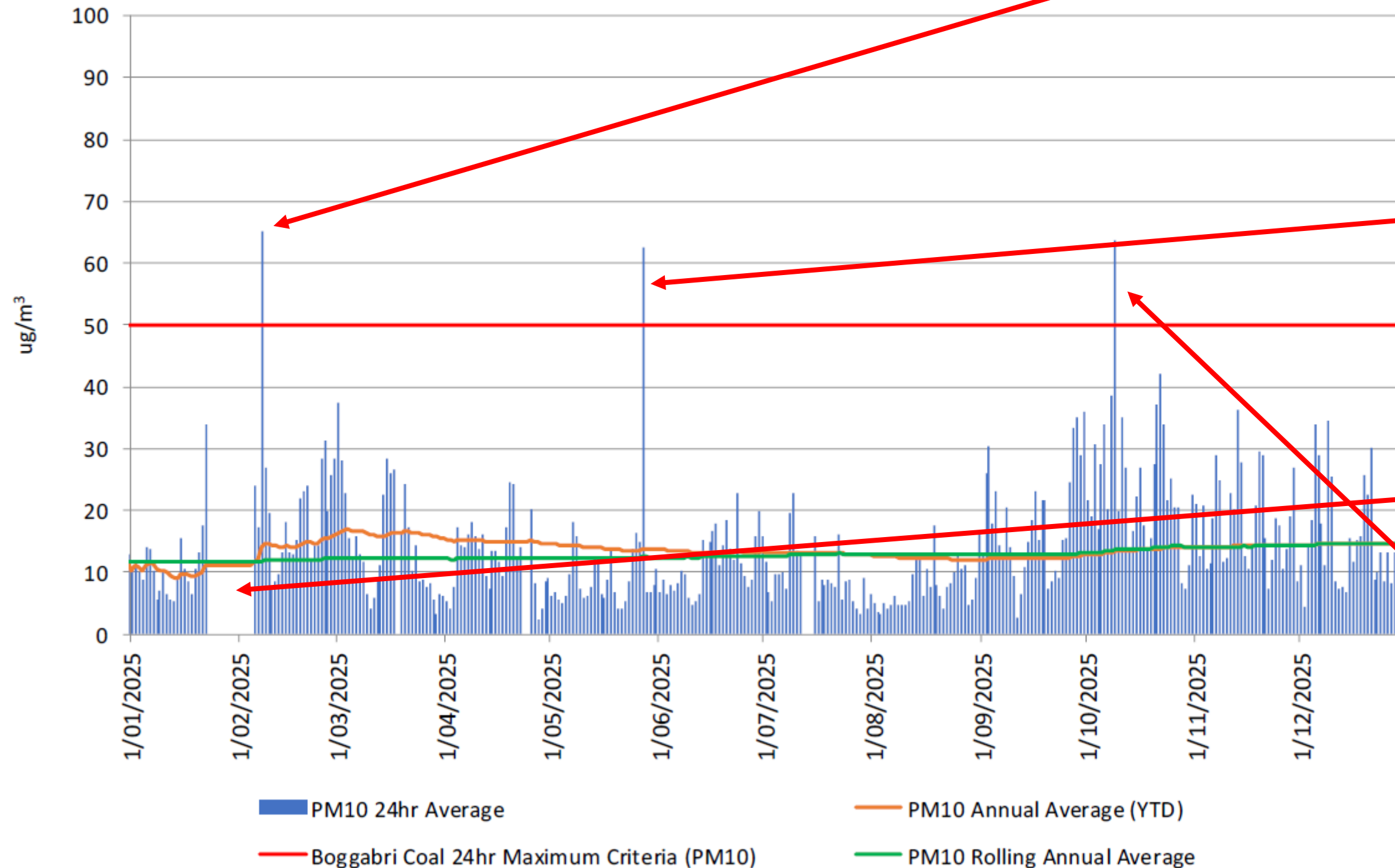
Air Quality Monitoring HVAS

Wilberoi East TEOM PM₁₀ January 2025 - December 2025



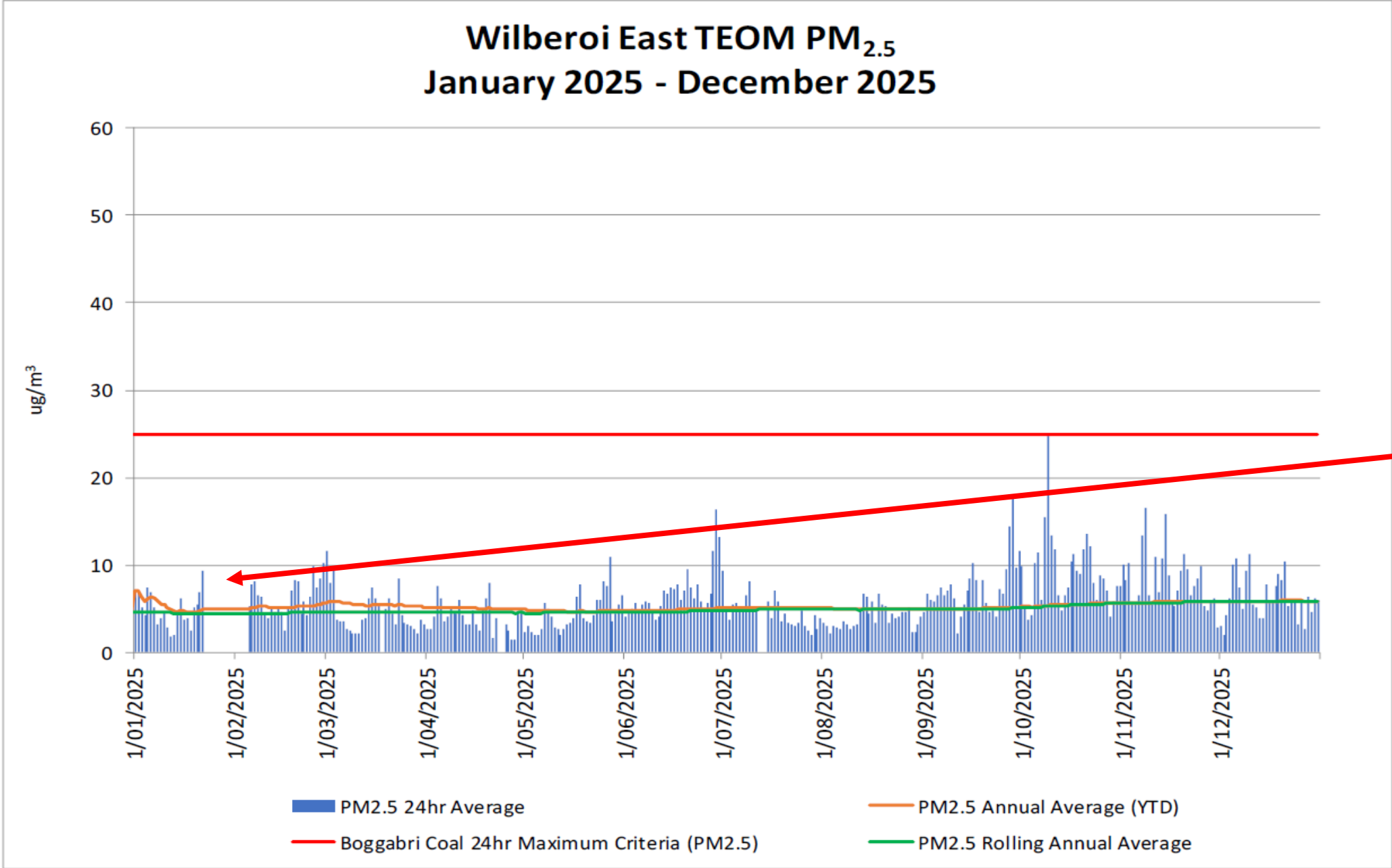

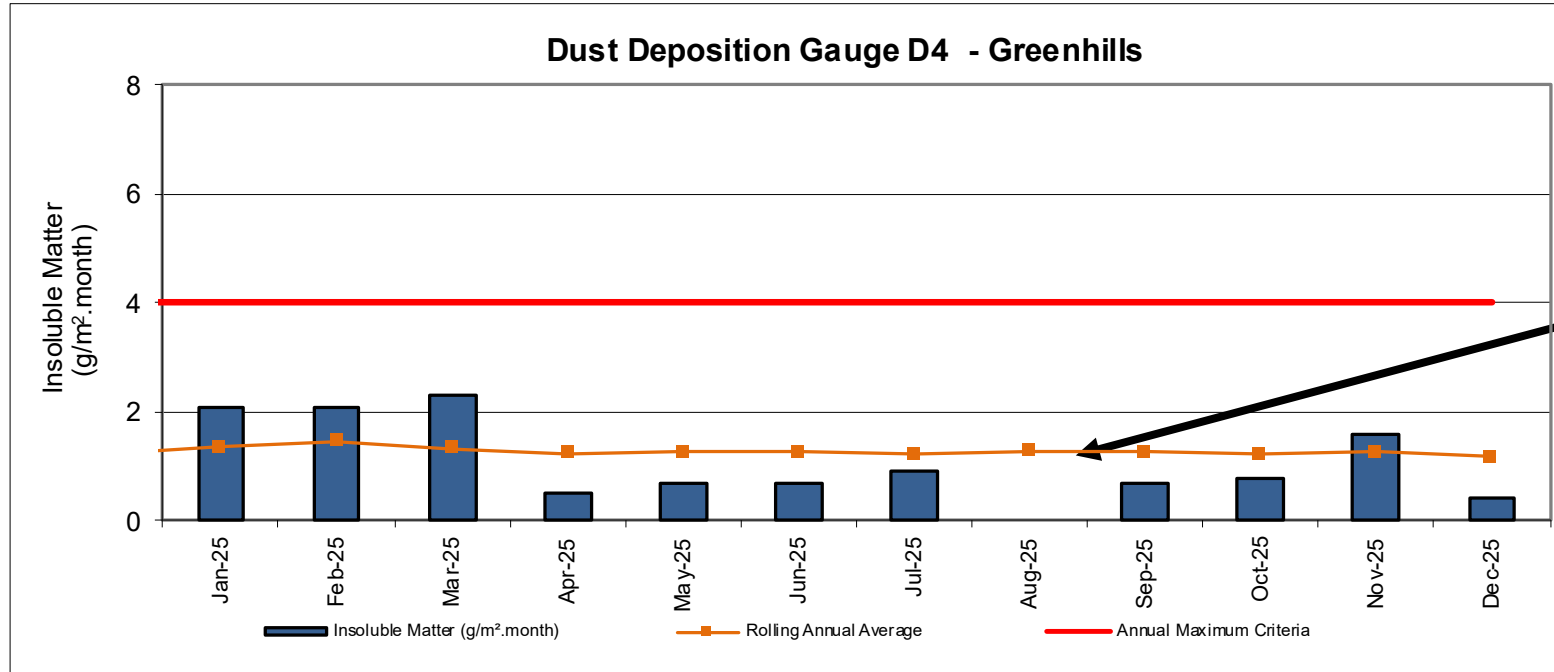

Air Quality TEOM PM2.5 Wilberoi East

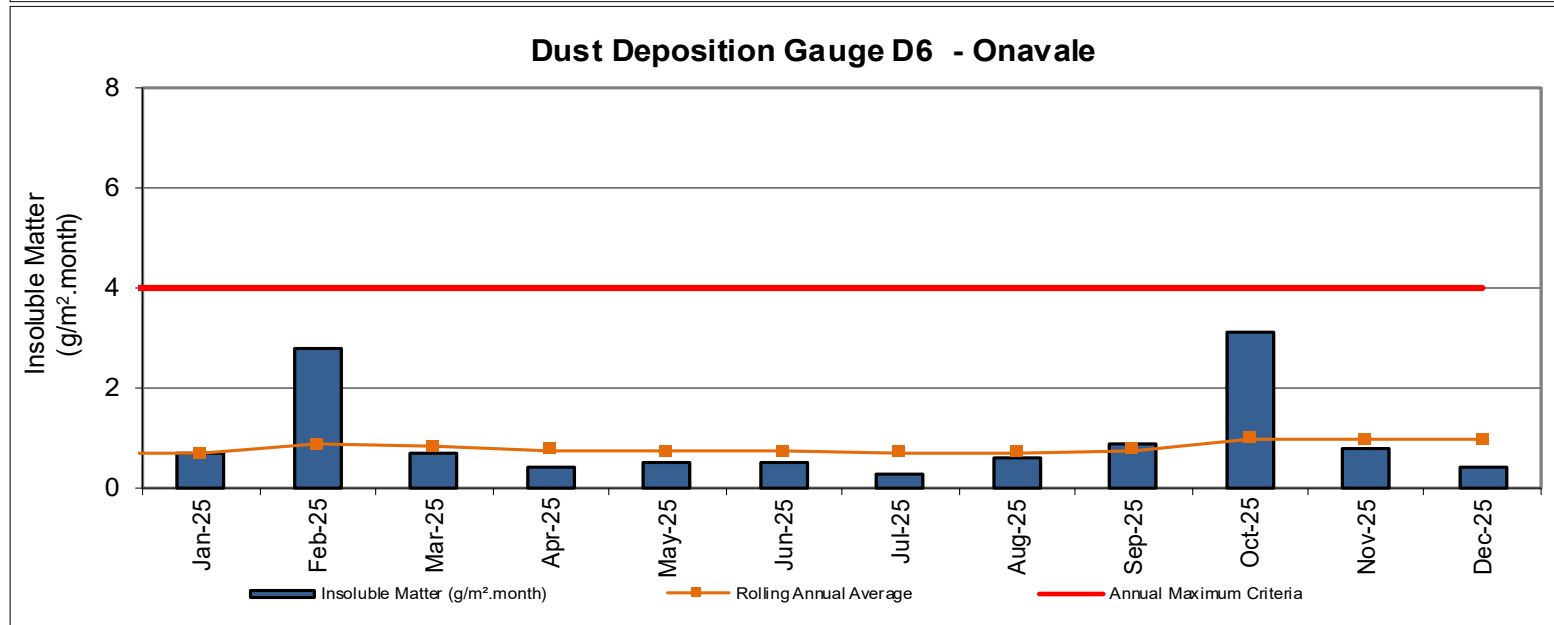
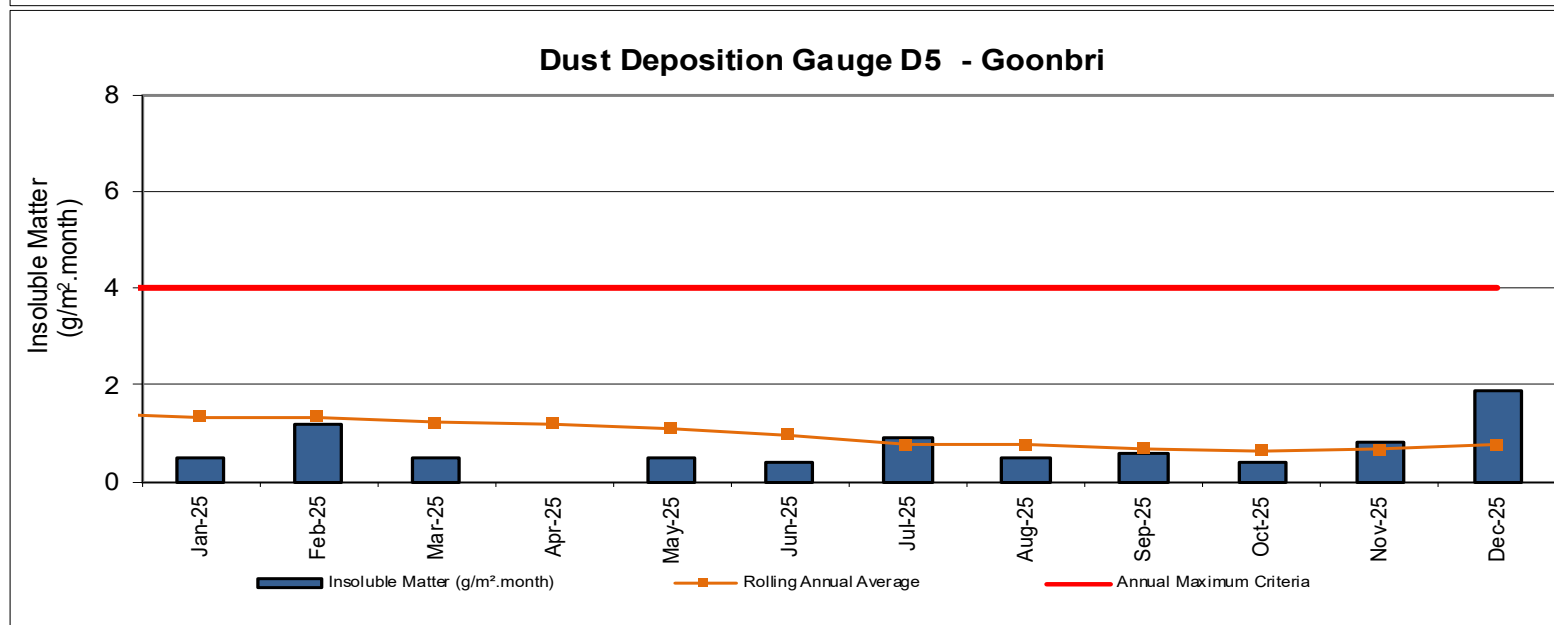


TEOM power outage which occurred from 23/01/2025 to 3/02/2025.

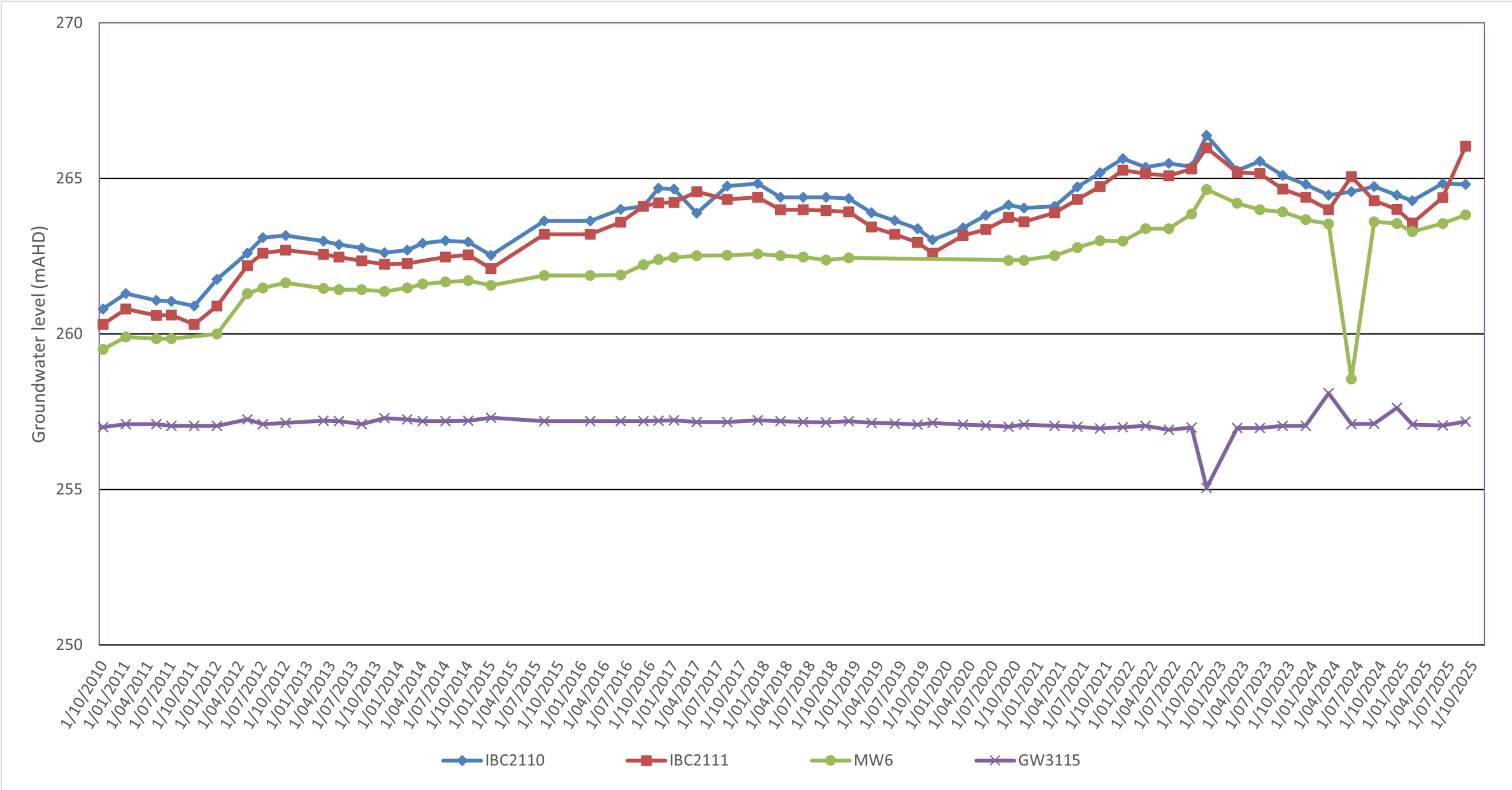

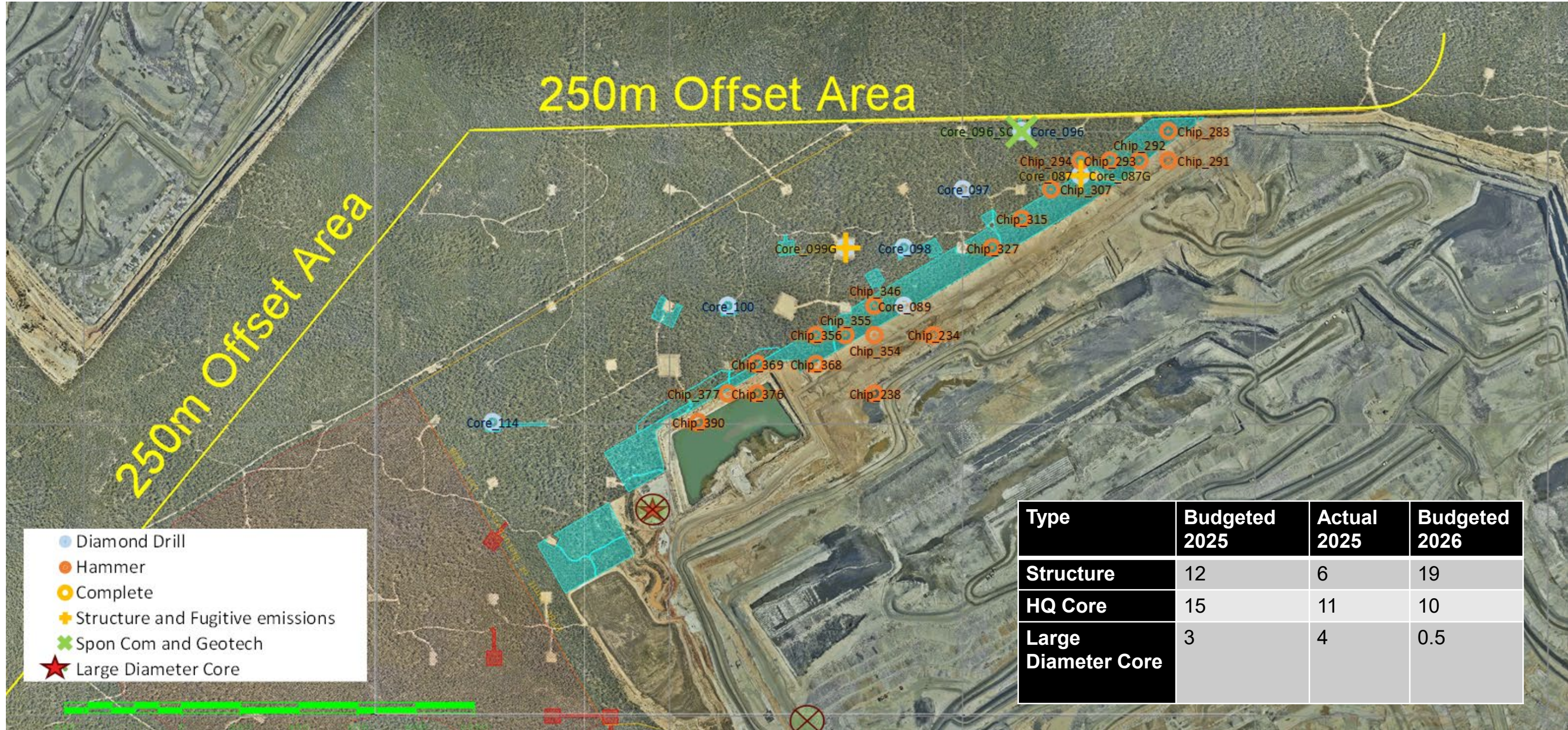

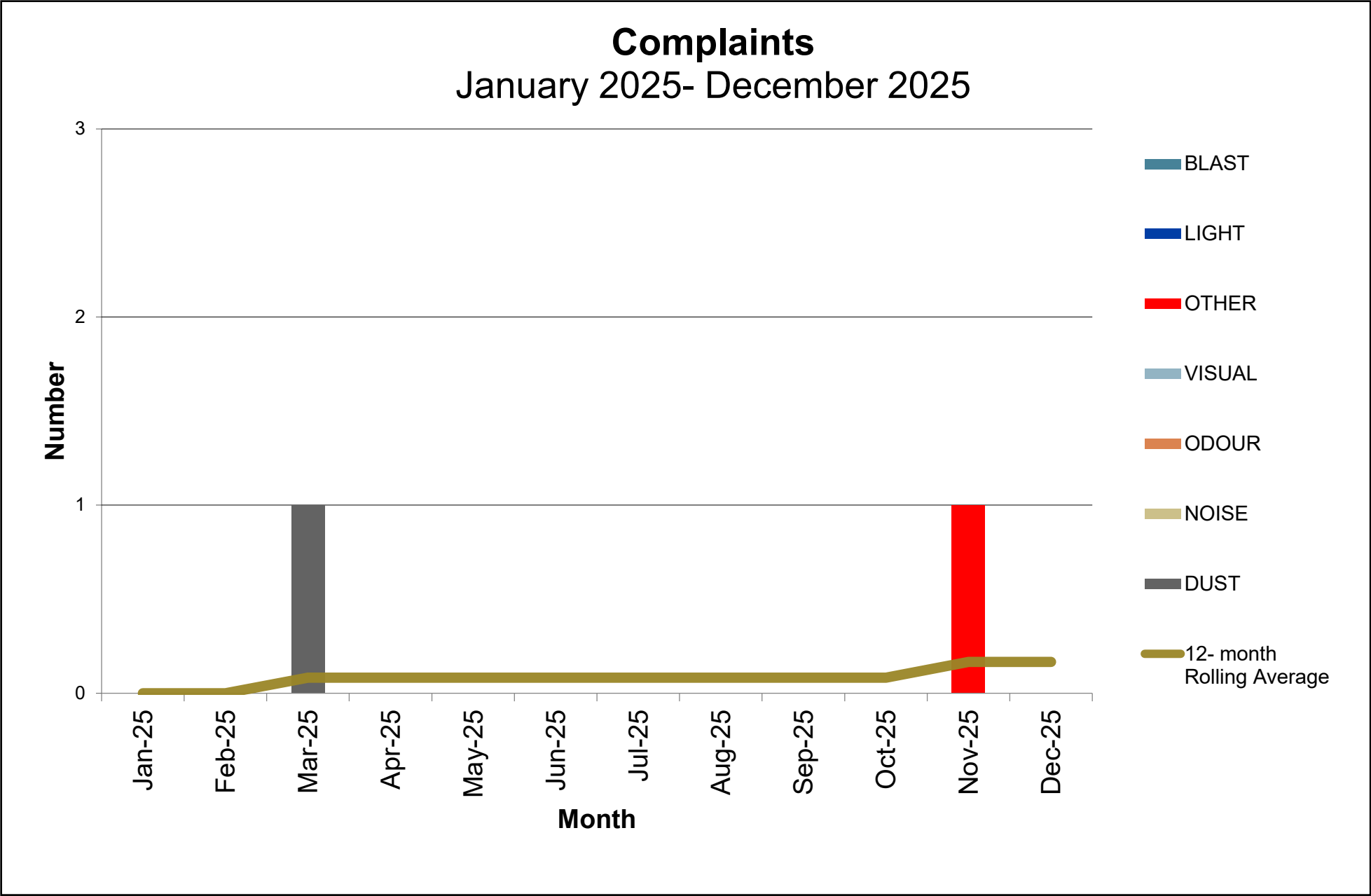
- Idemitsu are a member of the NSW Minerals council Tyre Stewardship Working Group.

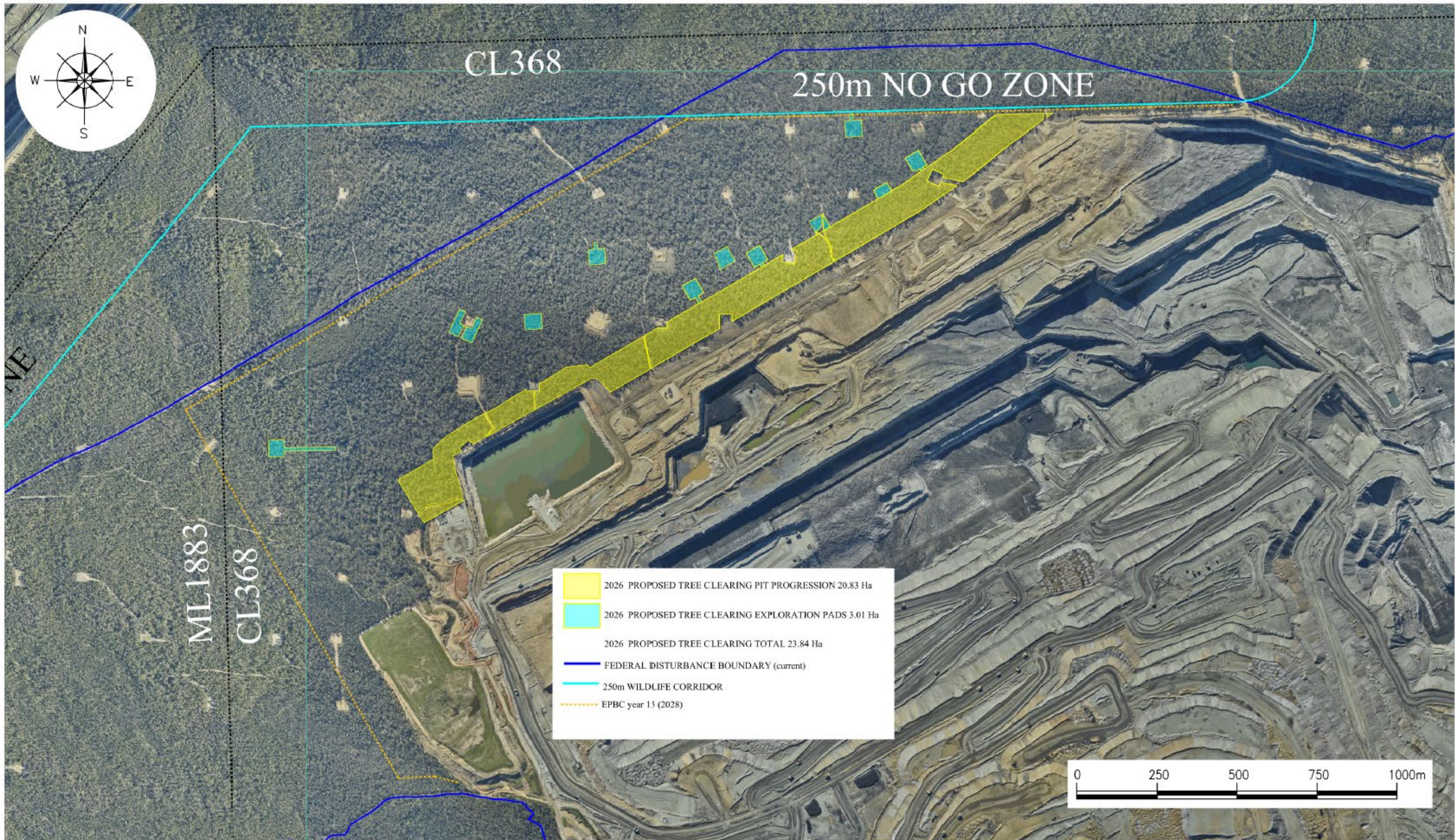
