	<p><i>the EPA’s approach to regional air quality monitoring will be provided at the BTM Joint CCC meeting to be held later in the day.</i></p> <p>6.2 AW to advise on membership of the Native Title liaison committee.</p> <p><i>Response: Membership will be provided when available.</i></p> <p>6.3 MJS to contact the EPA Director Operations, Western regarding more information on the EPA’s approach to HV tyre recycling.</p> <p><i>Response: MJS advised that he had spoken with the EPA Director Operations Western, Mr Scott Kidd regarding the EPA’s approach to HV tyre recycling. He reported that he had extended an invitation to Mr Kidd to attend the May BTM Joint CCC meeting to discuss HV tyre recycling. Mr Kidd advised that at this point there was little further to advise on HV tyre recycling given the recent restructure of the EPA and declined the invitation. MJS indicated that he would contact Mr Kidd again prior to the October 2026 CCC meetings.</i></p>	
<p>7.</p>	<p>Correspondence</p> <p>7.1 Department of Planning Housing and Infrastructure – Providing an update on the roles and responsibilities of the chairperson, community members, and the proponents of Community Consultative Committees (CCC). MJS stepped the Committee through the major points in the correspondence, noting that representations had been made by community members to the Planning Secretary regarding the operation of certain CCCs. MJS highlighted the comments regarding the recording of minutes, and the potential to engage a minute taker. He advised that due to previous difficulties in the recording of minutes, by a minute taker, at other CCC meetings he chairs, he has over the last six years assumed this role to ensure the content of the minutes are an accurate reflection of the intent and context of discussions at the CCC meeting. He noted that the roles and responsibilities of the CCC Chair were outlined in an attachment to the correspondence. MJS advised the correspondence would be distributed to the CCC.</p>	
<p>8.</p>	<p>Proponent’s Report</p> <p><i>A copy of the Proponent’s Report is attached to the minutes.</i></p> <p>Correspondence</p> <p>AW stepped the Committee through the list of correspondence, highlighting the more significant matters:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <p>NSW Department of Planning Housing and infrastructure (DPHI)</p> <p>AW advised that the failure of the air conditioner at the Wilberoi East TEOM was reported to DPHI on 11 February 2026.</p> <p>An exceedance at the ‘Glenhope’ HVAS on 13 April 2026 and another on 19 April 2026 were reported to DPHI. Probably caused by field dust or a fire nearby.</p> <p>AW advised the Annual Review was submitted on 27 March 2026. RD asked when it will be approved. AW suggested this is dependent on the DPHI and is likely to be towards the end of the year.</p> 	

- **Environment Protection Authority (EPA)**

AW noted that the Annual Return was lodged on 5 March 2023 and the 'Glenhope' exceedances advised to the EPA.

- **Biodiversity Conservation Trust**

AW reported on progress and actions associated with the Trust.

- **National Parks**

AW noted that the land transfer for handover of 'Mallee', 'Merriendi' and 'Myall Plains' is being finalised. RD asked whether 'Merriendi' is still owned by BCO? She advised an emaciated kangaroo was located on the road adjacent to the property and required euthanising – noting Police will not do it. She questioned whether BCO do this on the offsets. AW responded that these issues are dealt with on a case-by-case basis with the primary consideration being not putting staff in harm's way.

- **Resource Regulator**

AW noted that both the 2025 Annual Rehabilitation Report and 2026 Forward Plan and Rehabilitation Cost Estimate have been submitted.

- **Forestry Corporation of NSW**

AW advised that the compensation agreement for ML1883 is being drafted by Forestry.

- **Department of Climate Change, Energy, Environment and Water (Federal)**

AW advised that an information request had been received regarding to the audit conducted in 2025. The request related to various matters detailed in the conditions of approval in 2014.

- **Narrabri Shire Council**

AW advised the doctor's housing units at Boggabri have been approved by Narrabri Shire Council to fulfill two dwellings of the Narrabri Housing Commitment.

- **NSW Natural Resources Access Regulator**

The first quarter report has been submitted in accordance with the EU requirement.

- **Native Title**

AW commented that progress is being made in setting up a corporate body to manage native title.

Operational Update

Production Targets

It was noted that 2.6 million tonnes of coal had been mined to date in 2026, with 2.3 million tonnes railed.

AW then outlined the key projects for 2026:

- Finalise edge of pit maintenance and fuel facility.
- Expansion of workshop and warehouse.
- Vanadium battery construction
- Doctor's housing construction in Boggabri.

AW commented that the Vanadium Battery construction has started, whilst it is anticipated that construction of the doctor's housing will commence towards the end of the year.

Housing Voluntary Planning Agreement

AW reported that the 'Glentarkie' dwellings are complete with discussions continuing in respect of the remaining 18 dwellings.

Environmental Monitoring

Water

The Committee noted the surface and groundwater tables and the rainfall graph.

AW advised that investigations are underway to install a pump on the river. ST advised that the total take from the river would be 143 megalitres. RD sought clarification on the regulated river water allocation. AW advised the licenced allocation is 322 megalitres. RD requested confirmation that this is the actual allocation for the year. ST responded that this information will be available at the end of the water year (30 June). AW commented that a range of factors determine the allocation, with ST noting that it is dependent on the dam releases by WaterNSW. The extent of the actual allocation and 2025 usage were taken on notice.

It was noted that 76.4mm of rain was received during the first quarter of 2026 with conditions of recent months being very dry. AW advised that water from the decommissioned mine water dam, MW5 has been transferred to the new mine water storage dam MW11. RD enquired how many small dams remain? AW responded, about 10 (11 in total) with the Surface Water Management Plan detailing storage management on the site.

The Committee noted the map and tables associated with noise monitoring.

The Committee noted the air quality monitoring tables.



She questioned what the criteria is for a modification as opposed to a new development. EOH supported the question. MJS commented that it fundamentally relates to the modification being ‘substantially the same’ as the original development as assessed by the DPHI – it is a matter for the Department to determine whether a modification proposal will result in new or increased negative environmental or social impacts. 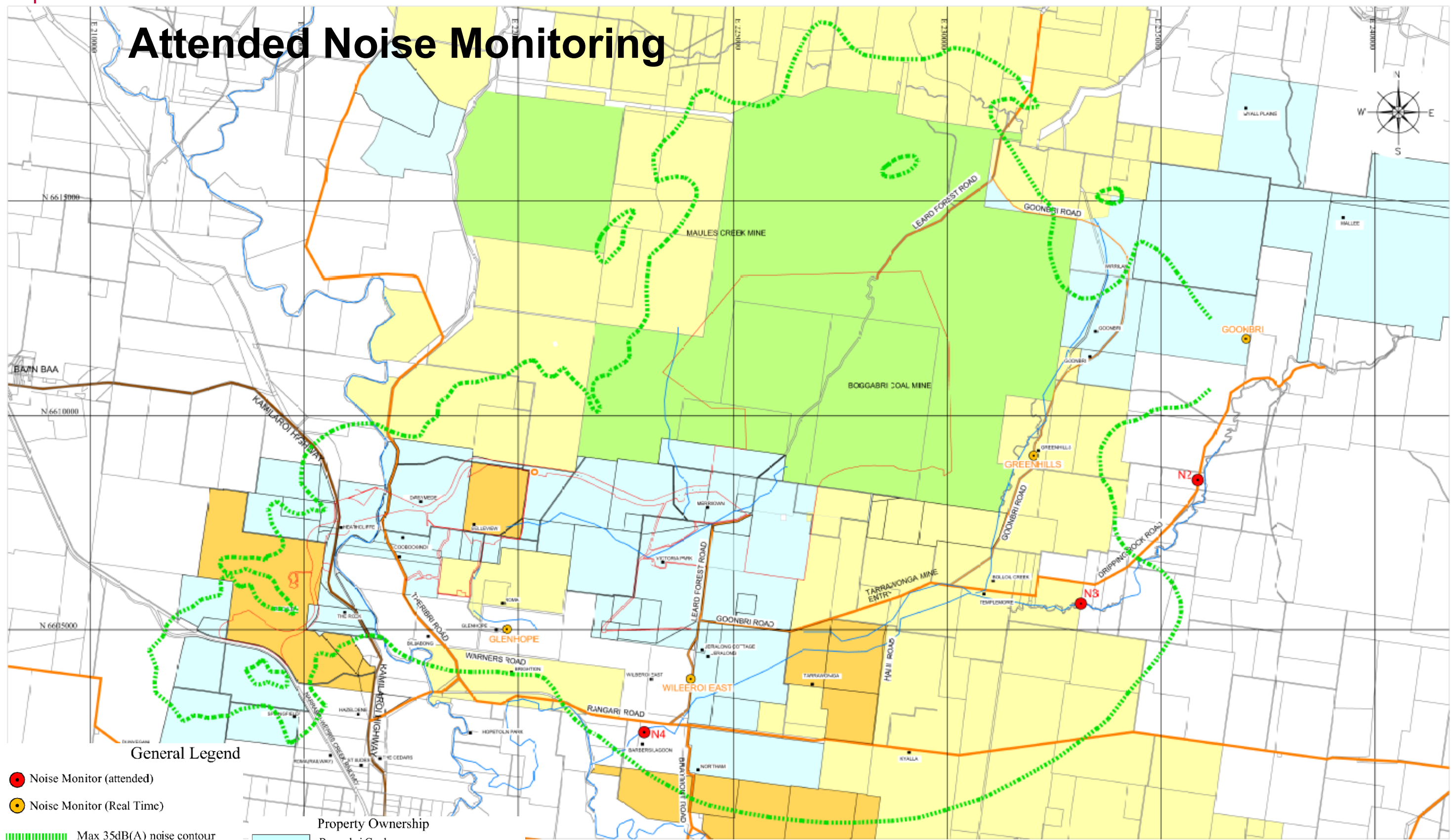

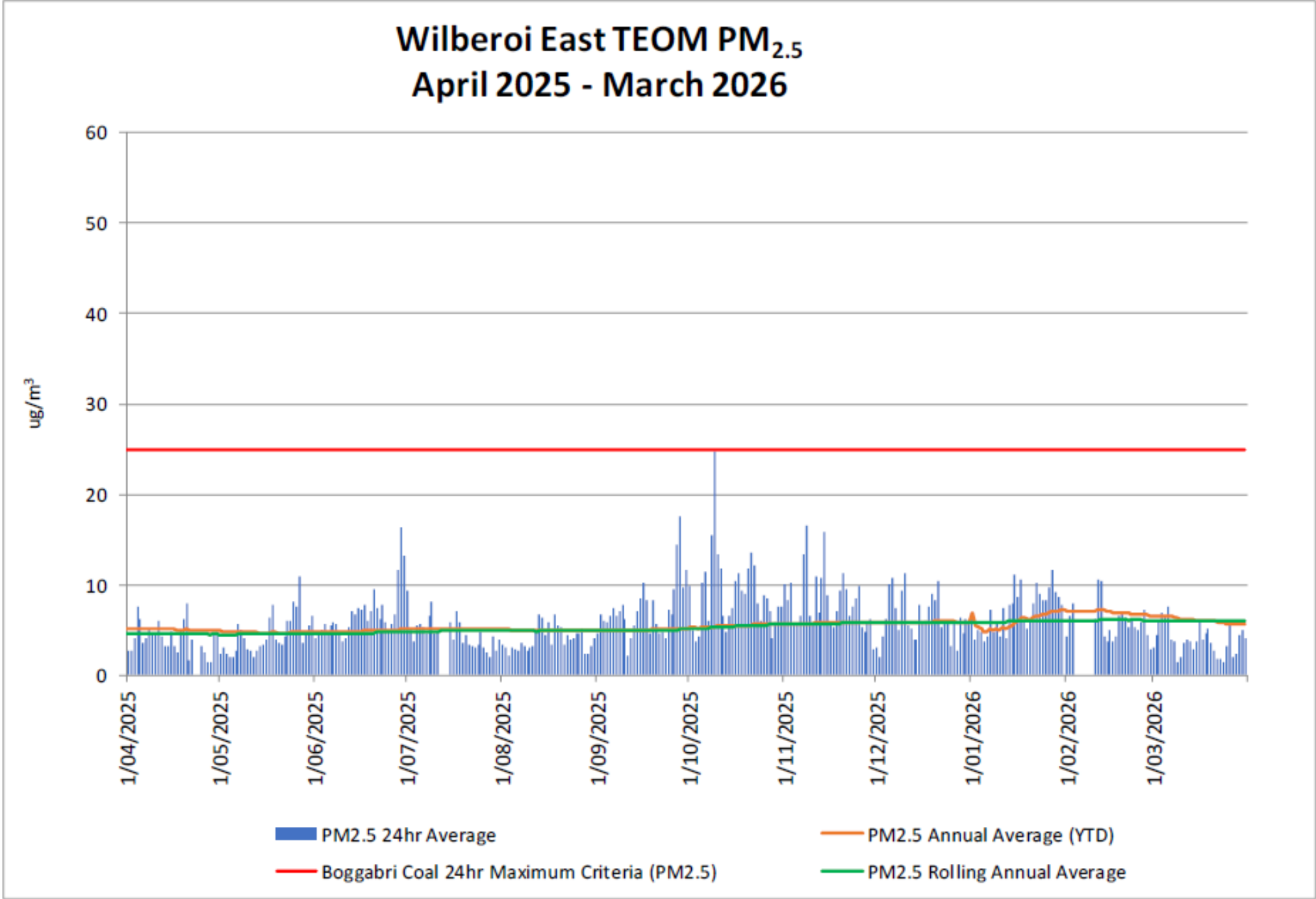
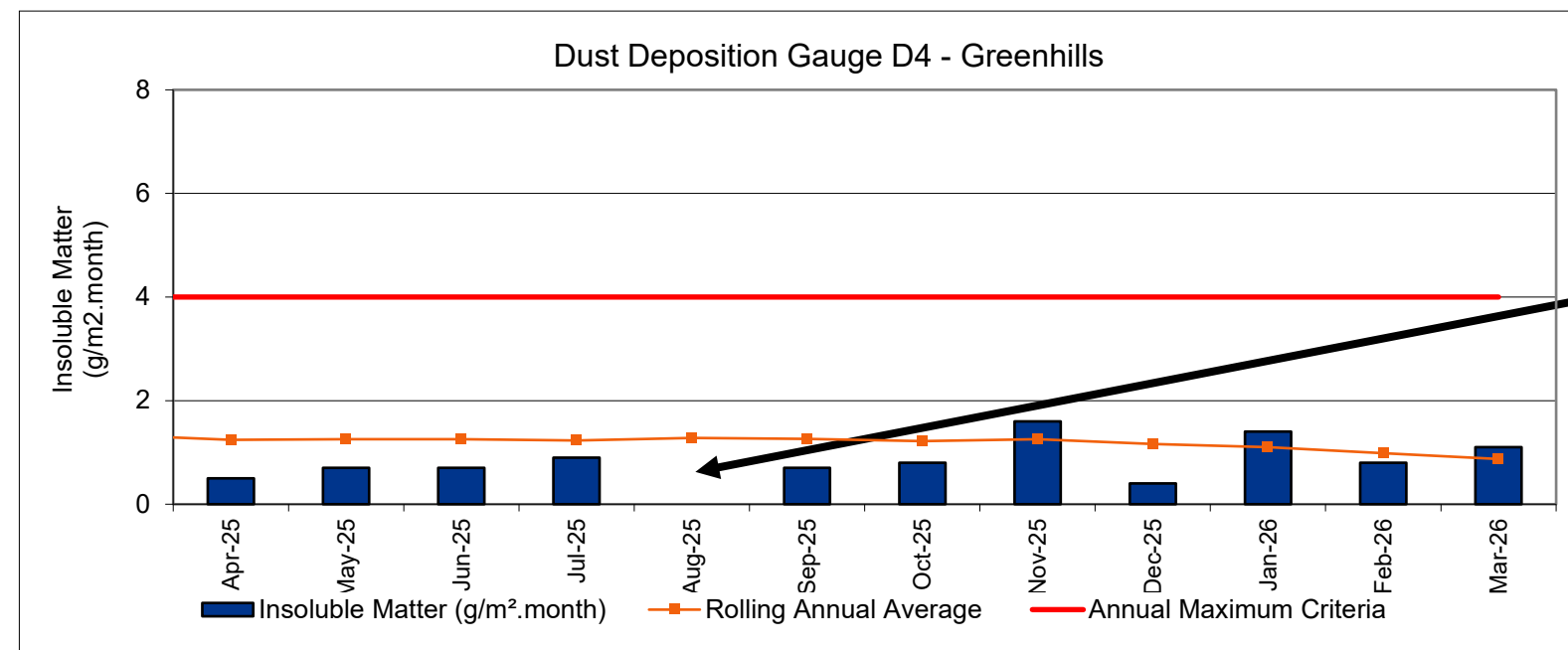
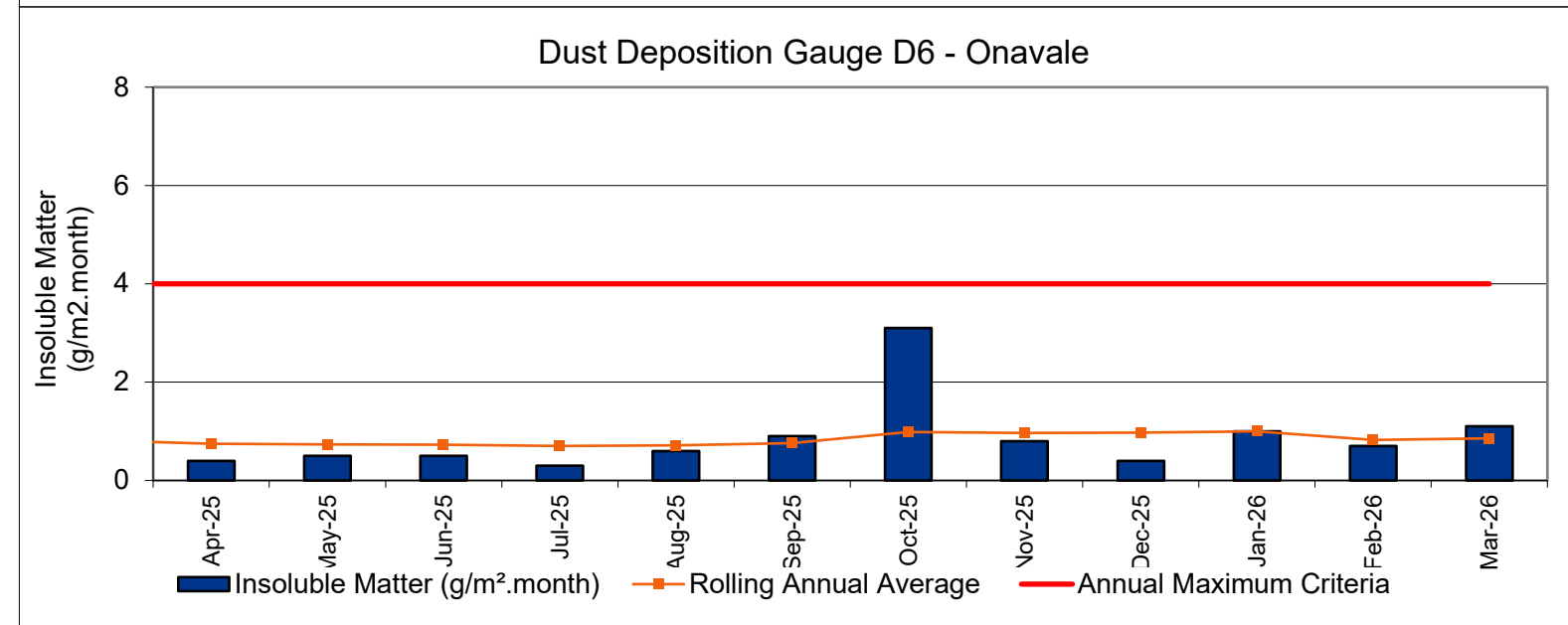
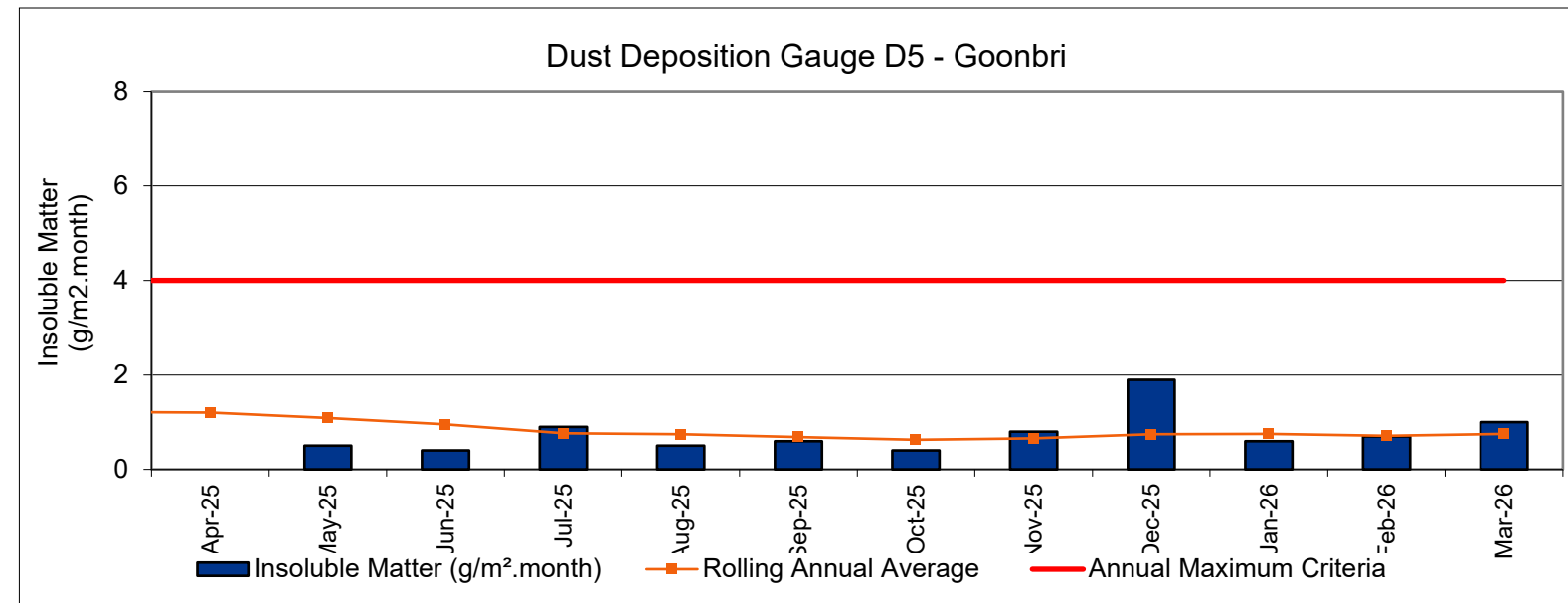


Figure 7: Wilberoi East PM_{2.5} previous 12-month 24hr averages and annual YTD average

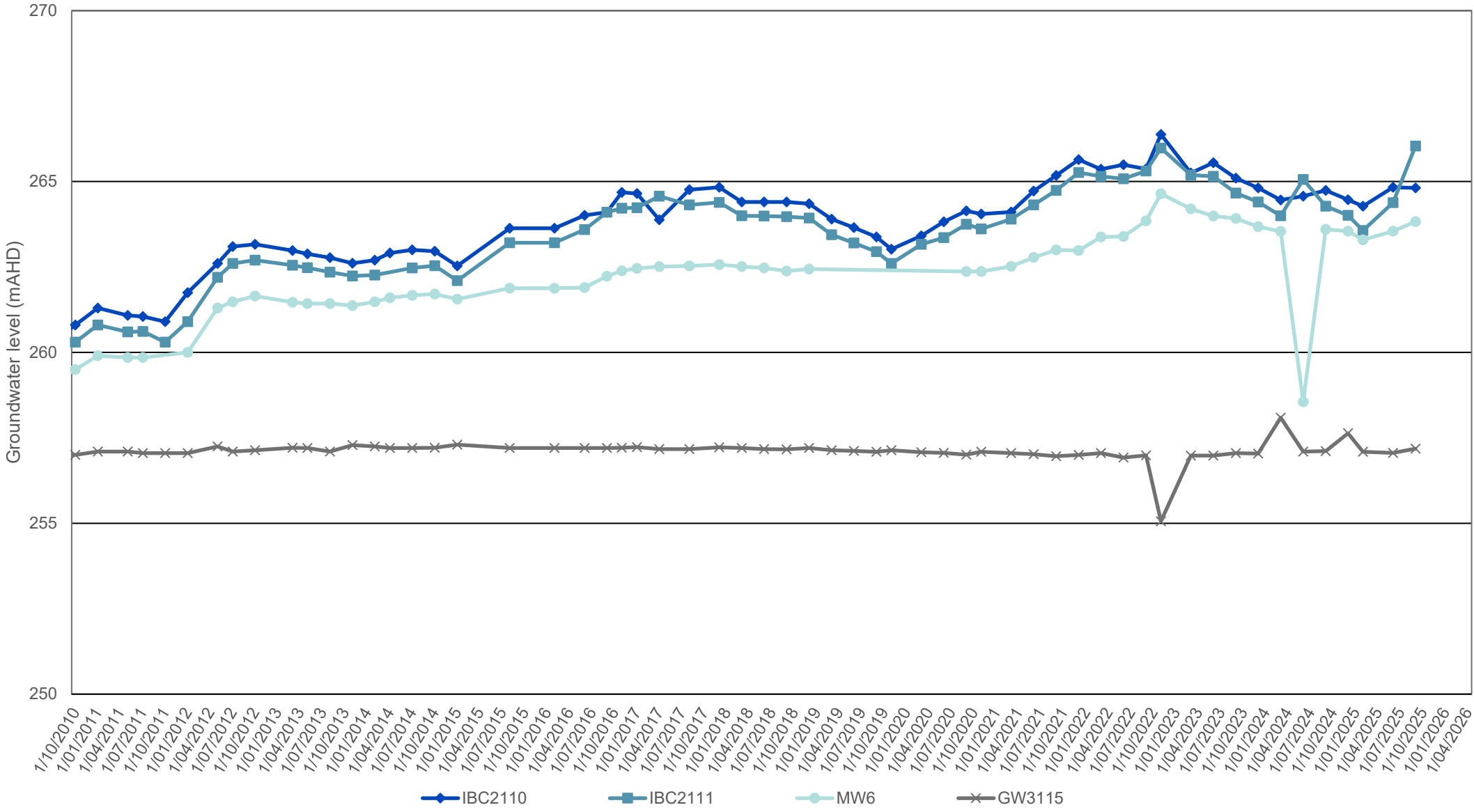

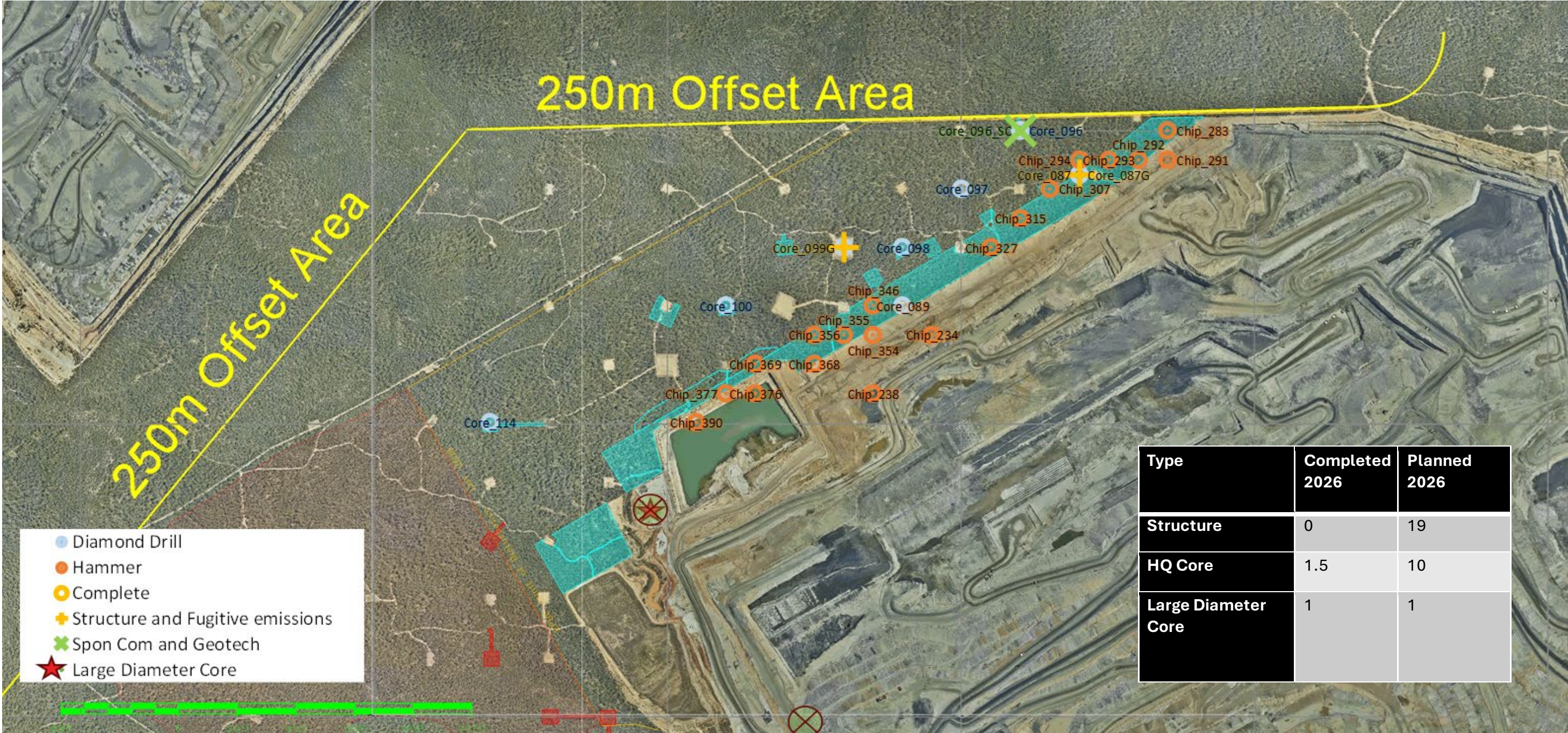

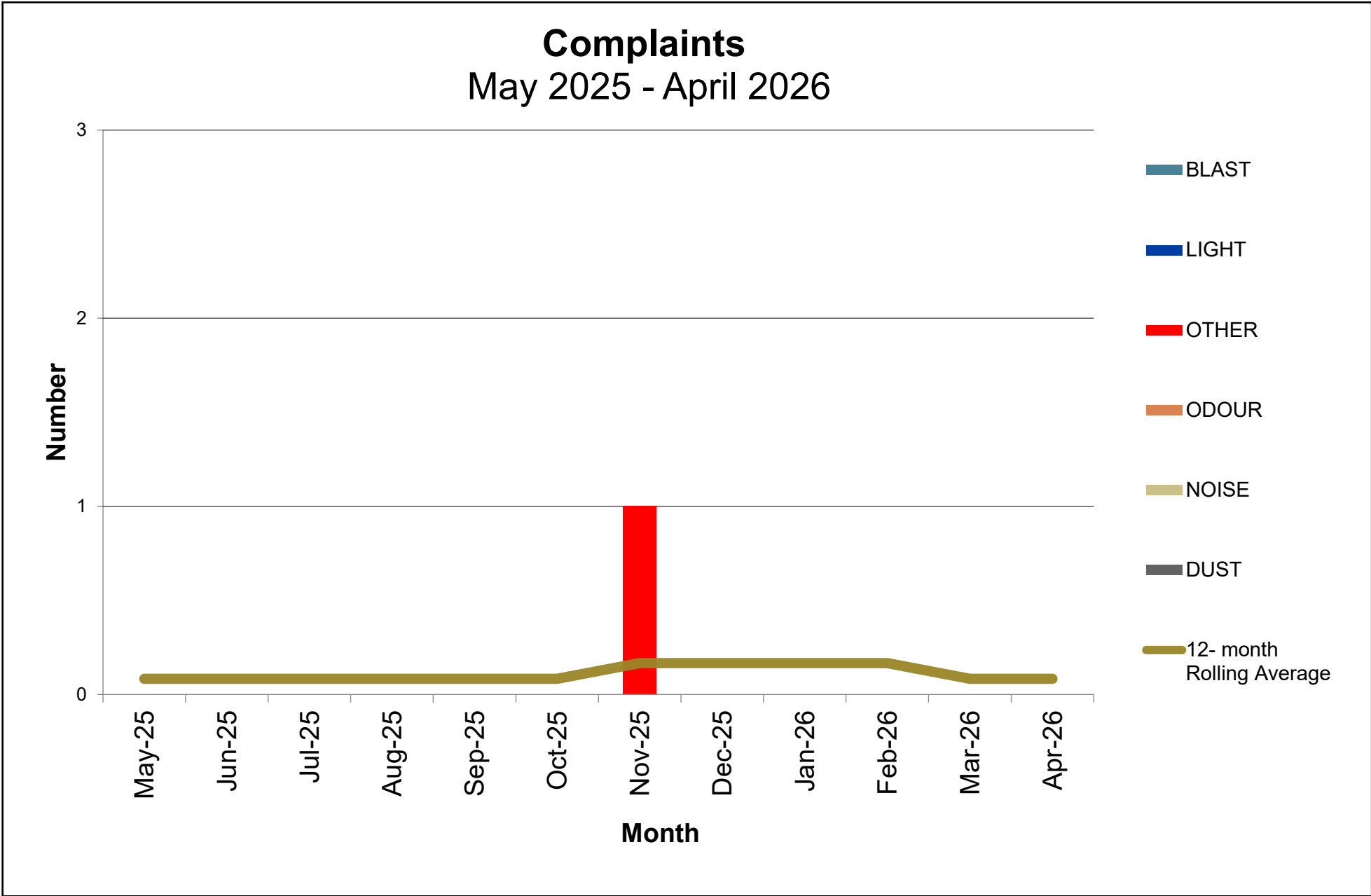
- Idemitsu are a member of the NSW Minerals council Tyre Stewardship Working Group.
