

Minutes: Minutes of the meeting of the Boggabri Coal Community Consultative Committee held on Thursday 27 August 2026 at the Boggabri Golf Club commencing at 9.04 am.

Agenda Item	Discussion	Action/By Whom
1.	Welcome – MJS welcomed everyone to the meeting in particular Cr Strahl attending his first meeting and Narrabri Shire Council’s Director Development and Compliance, Kate Alberry. It was agreed that Ms Alberry, as an Observer, could participate in discussion without the approval of the Chair.	
2.	Acknowledgement of Country - The Chair acknowledged the Traditional Owners of the land on which the meeting is being held and their continuing connection to land, water, and culture, paying respects to their Elders past, present and emerging and any Aboriginal person present at the meeting.	
3.	Declaration of pecuniary or other interests -. MJS advised his expenses are borne by the Proponent. There were no other declarations of pecuniary interest.	
4.	Minutes of the previous meeting – The minutes of the meeting of 13 May 2026 were approved on 10 June 2026.	
5.	Business Arising 5.1 Housing Voluntary Planning Agreement – SP clarified the status of the doctors’ housing units in Boggabri and the further 18 dwellings to be constructed. The completion of the Glentarkie dwellings and the Early Learning Facility has fulfilled BCO’s commitment to construct 10 dwellings in Boggabri. BCO has received approval from Narrabri Shire Council to construct a duplex in Boggabri, for medical practitioners. This will require a modification application to transfer two dwellings from Narrabri to Boggabri, leaving Narrabri with 18 dwellings. Consultation for the remaining 18 dwellings is ongoing with Narrabri Shire Council	

6.	Actions 6.1 MN to approach BCO re local tyre recycling opportunity when timing is appropriate. Response: No action noted KA highlighted Narrabri Shire Council’s interest in developing a tyre recycling facility in the Shire. She noted a collaboration between Council and the University of NSW (UNSW) to potentially develop a mini factory in Narrabri. KA further advised that UNSW is seeking grant funding for development of a Narrabri based facility. 6.2 Chair to discuss with the EPA the potential for a future presentation at a BTM Joint Mines CCC meeting regarding air quality monitoring. Response: MJS advised that the matter was considered at the BTM Joint Mines CCC meeting in May 2026. It was determined there be support for an EPA regional air quality monitor in the Boggabri area. However, it was also noted that given the restructure of the EPA it was most unlikely there would be further advice on air quality monitoring or the opportunity of a presentation on the matter until mid-2027. MJS suggested that no further action occur on the matter until after discussions with the EPA in October 2026. 6.2 AW to advise on membership of the Native Title liaison committee. Response: Membership will be provided when available. 6.3 ST to provide details on the annual river water allocation and the usage for 2025. Response: Matter addressed in Proponent’s report 6.4 MJS to obtain advice from DPHI on criteria relating to modification of a development consent. Response: MJS advised that links to the DPHI website on how modifications are assessed was forwarded to RD and EOH shortly after the meeting. DPHI had no further comment on the assessment process. 7.	Correspondence Nil	
8.	Proponent’s Report <i>A copy of the Proponent’s Report is attached to the minutes.</i> River Water Allocation ST advised that Boggabri Coal has not pumped from the Namoi River since 2018. She commented it is not viable to pump from the river from a commercial perspective but a decision to re-install a river pump has not yet been made. She advised that allocation for river water is issued from the government on the 7th of each month through a Water Statement Summary. EOH questioned the allocation process. RD commented on the Upper Namoi Zone 4 (Namoi Valley-Keepit Dam to Gin's Leap) water allocations for the 2025–26 water year. ST explained the table in the presentation and noted the available allocation includes the licenced allocation and any annual ‘carry-over’ resulting in a ‘build-up’ of	

available water in the account. ST confirmed that the numbers are correct in the water take slides noting that 2,880.9 ML is in the account for the 2026-27 water year commencing 1 July.

Tree Clearing

The Committee noted the contents of the tables.

Correspondence

ST stepped the Committee through the list of correspondence, highlighting the more significant matters:

- **NSW Department of Planning Housing and infrastructure (DPHI)**

ST advised a notification sent to DPHI regarding Glenhope HVAS exceedance on the 1 May 2026. EOH noted that Tapered Element Oscillating Microbalance (TEOM) monitors will not be manufactured in the future. ST was aware of the issue and consequently servicing parts are being ordered. EOH requested that advice from the EPA on how this monitoring issue is to be addressed.

ST noted that BCO will be required to submit modification application to modify the Housing Commitment in Schedule 3, Condition 75 relative to transfer of the construction of two dwellings from Narrabri township to Boggabri township for the doctors' housing.

Advised DPHI of the investigation of groundwater quality trigger value exceedances at monitoring bore MW6 being a natural phenomenon and not a mine related cause.

- **Environment Protection Authority (EPA)**

ST advised of reporting changes in respect of the Environmental Protection Licence.

- **Biodiversity Conservation Trust**

ST reported regular progress meetings are being held regarding close out of spatial data and monitoring requirements

- **National Parks**

ST noted that the land transfer for handover of 'Mallee', 'Merriendi' and 'Myall Plains' is being finalised.

- **Resource Regulator**

ST advised of the latest targeted assessment in respect of material and soils.

- **Forestry Corporation of NSW**

ACTION: MJS to obtain advice from EPA on the replacement for TEOMs.

ST advised that the Forestry compensation agreement for ML1883 is being finalised

- **Department of Climate Change, Energy, Environment and Water (Federal)**

ST advised the draft Audit Report received from November 2025 audit, finding five non-compliances. AW noted that four non-compliances related to historical conditions from 2012-2014. The more recent non-compliance was due to a failure to advise the Secretary of progress in achieving a conservation covenant by the end of September 2025.

- **Narrabri Shire Council**

ST advised of ongoing discussions with NSC regarding the Narrabri Housing Commitment.

- **NSW Natural Resources Access Regulator**

The second quarter report has been submitted in accordance with the EU requirement.

- **Native Title**

ST advised this is an ongoing matter - awaiting Liaison committee to form an entity.

Operational Update

Production Targets

ST stepped the Committee through the production targets for 2026. It was noted that 5.0 million tonnes of coal had been mined to date in 2026, with 4.4 million tonnes railed.

ST then outlined the key projects for 2026:

- Finalise edge of pit maintenance and fuel facility.
- Expansion of workshop and warehouse.
- Vanadium battery construction
- Doctor's housing construction in Boggabri.

MOD 10 Update

ST advised on the status of MOD 10 noting that draft conditions of approval have been received.

Housing Voluntary Planning Agreement

ST advised that Narrabri Shire Council has approved the construction of a duplex for medical practitioners in Boggabri. However, a Modification application will be required for the transfer of two dwellings from Narrabri township to Boggabri township. Consultation regarding the remaining 18 dwellings is ongoing. AW advised the duplex will be located on BCO-owned land in Wee Waa Street, Boggabri.

In response to a question from the Chair regarding how the doctors' units will be managed, AW indicated BCO will develop a lease agreement with Hunter New England Health.

Environmental Monitoring

Water

The Committee noted the surface and groundwater tables and the rainfall graph.

Noise Monitoring

The Committee noted the map and tables associated with noise monitoring.

Air Quality Monitoring

The Committee noted the air quality monitoring tables.

Blasting

The Committee noted the Blast Summary.

Groundwater

The Committee took account of the monitoring graph.

2025 HV tyre disposal

ST advised that 292 tyres have been disposed of in-pit during 2026, with 57 tyres recycled to date. ST indicated that recycling of tyres 51 inches and below is ongoing and will continue for another year.

Exploration Drilling 2026

The Committee reviewed the Exploration Drilling Map in the presentation. RD enquired as to the purpose of the drilling. AW responded that it provides considerable geotechnical and development information and informs on the potential for spontaneous combustion.

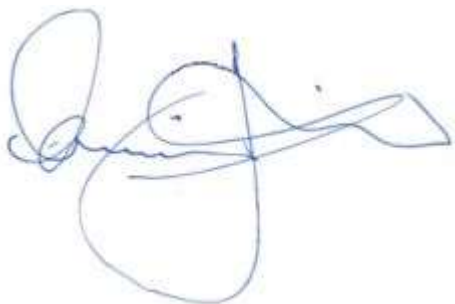
It was noted that \$281,866.00 has been committed in sponsorship to organisations or events for 2026.

General discussion then proceeded on the implication of the high pathogenicity avian influenza (HPAI) H5N1 virus. 10.2 Consultation Assessment SP circulated a feedback survey to Committee members regarding consultation and engagement processes. 10.3 Annual Review ST advised there has been no advice from DPHI regarding the submission of the Annual Review. 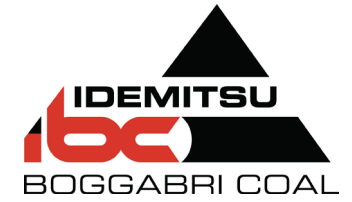

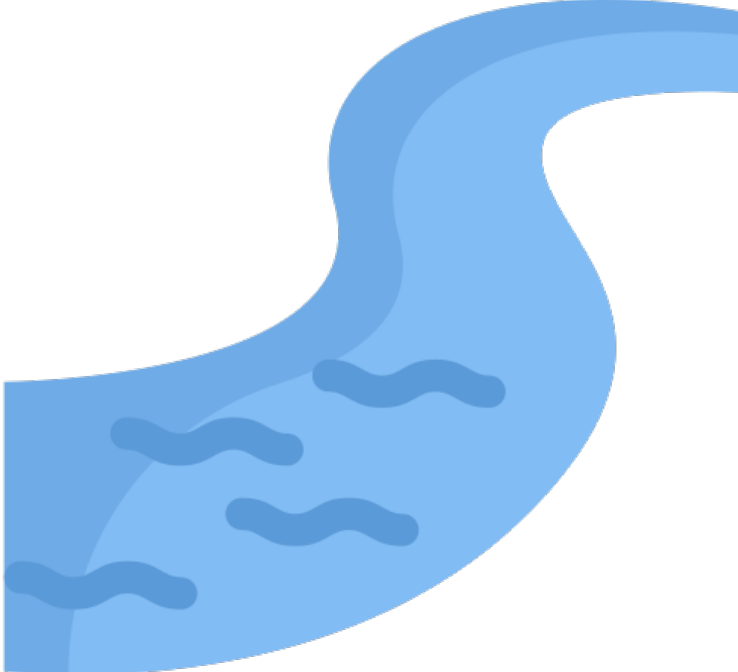

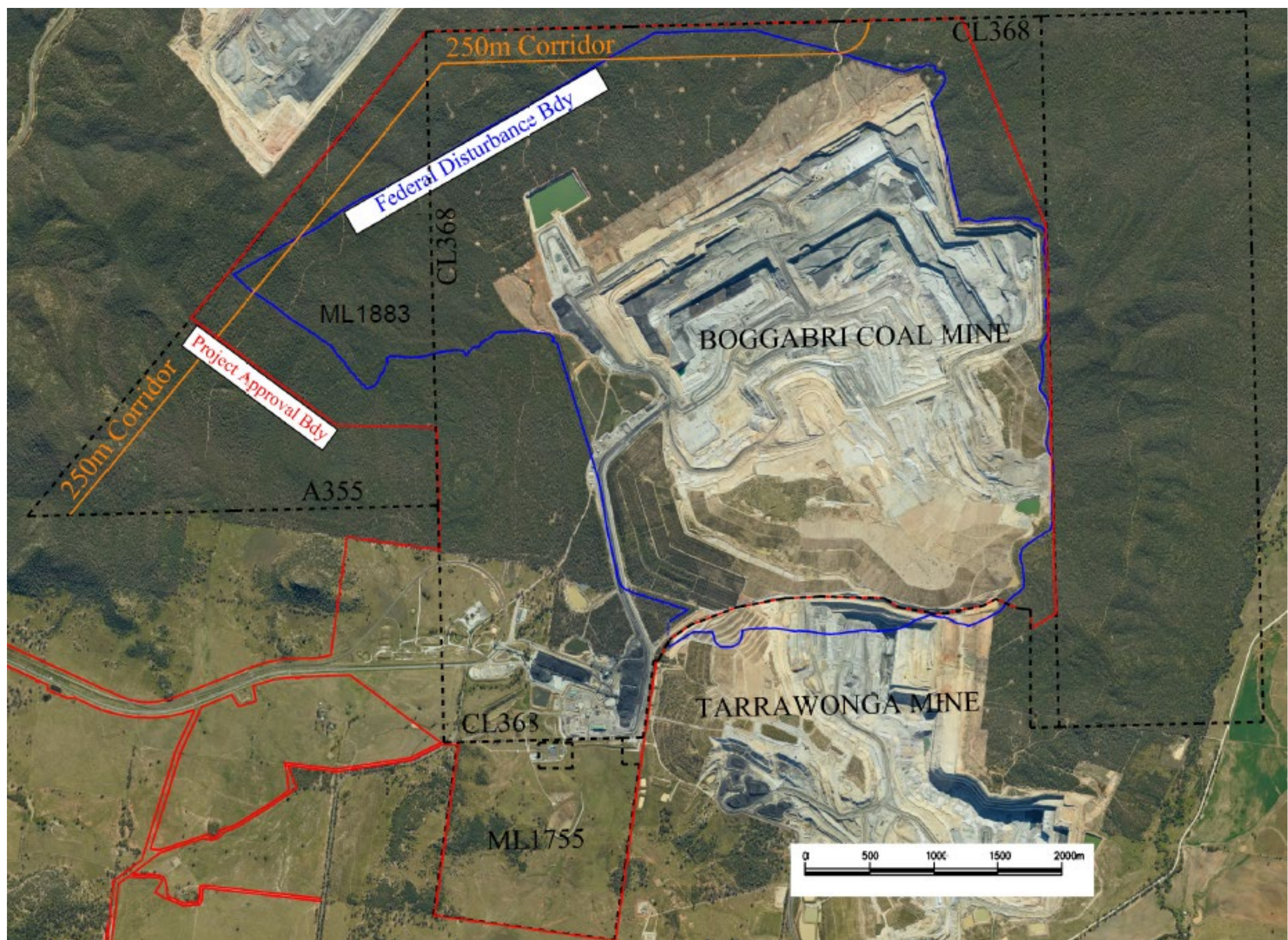


Photo 3.3 Little Broad-nosed Bat (*Scotorepens greyii*) (relocated)

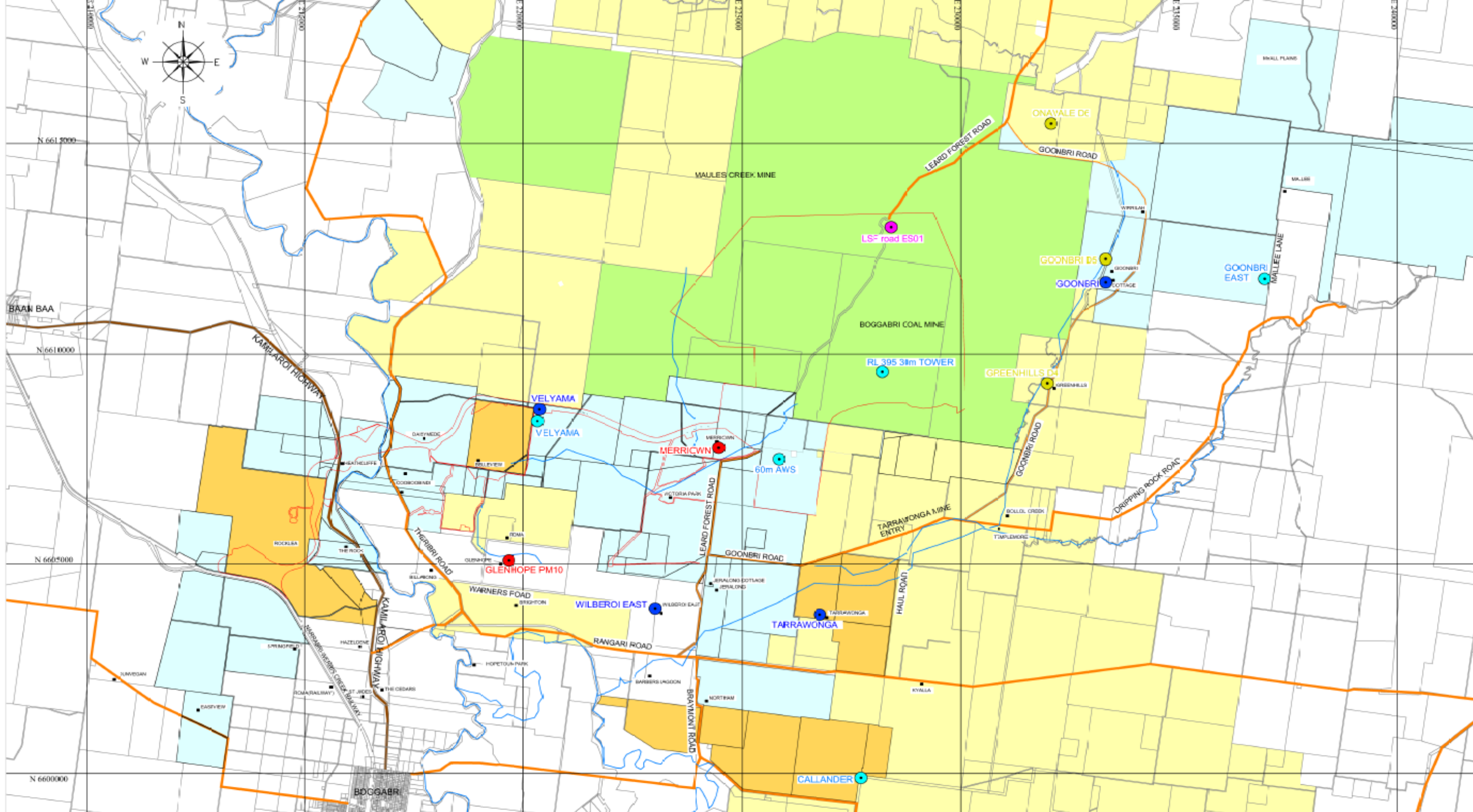

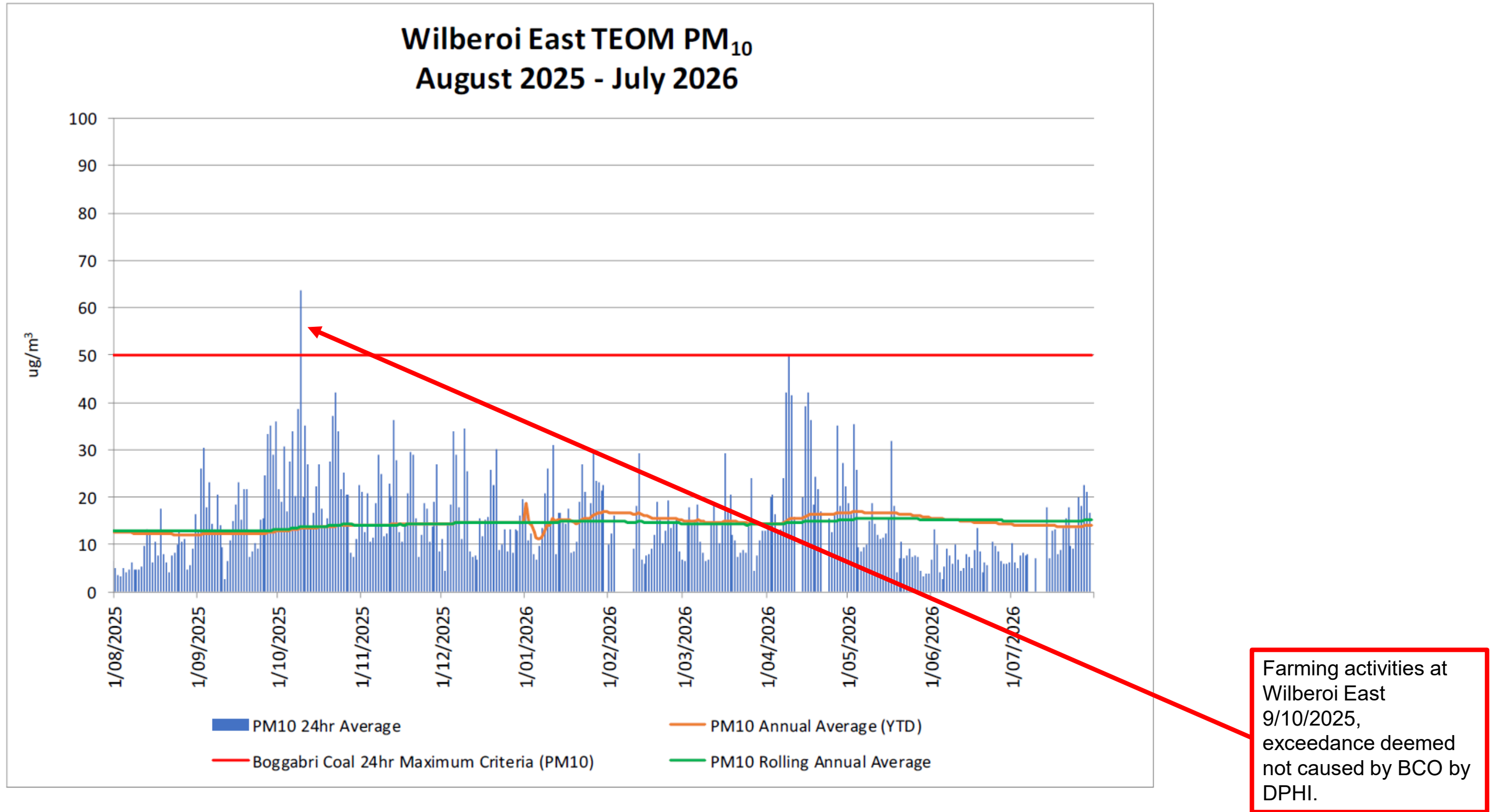


Figure 5: Wilberoi East PM₁₀ previous 12-month 24hr averages and annual YTD average

Air Quality TEOM PM2.5 Wilberoi East

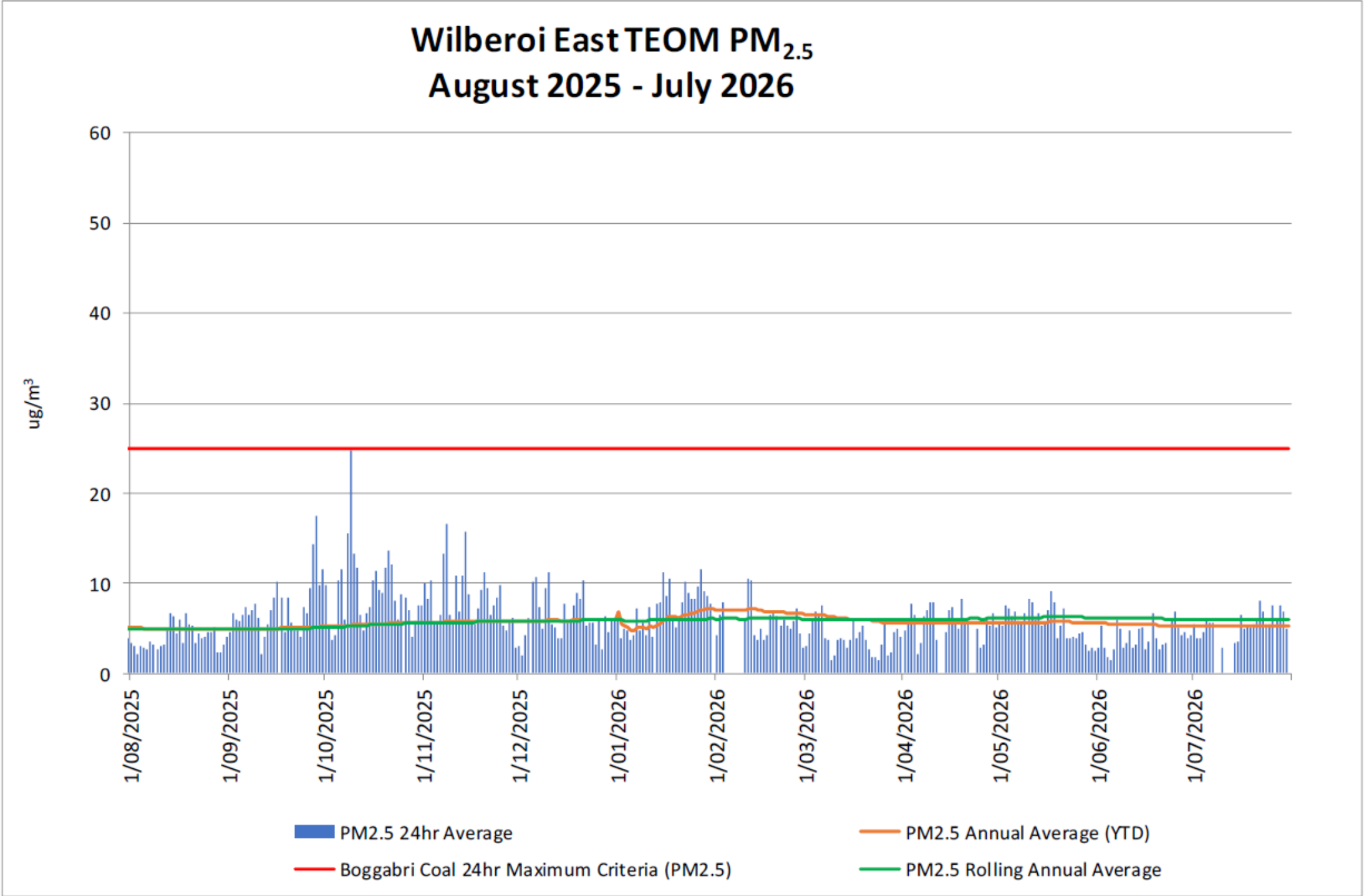
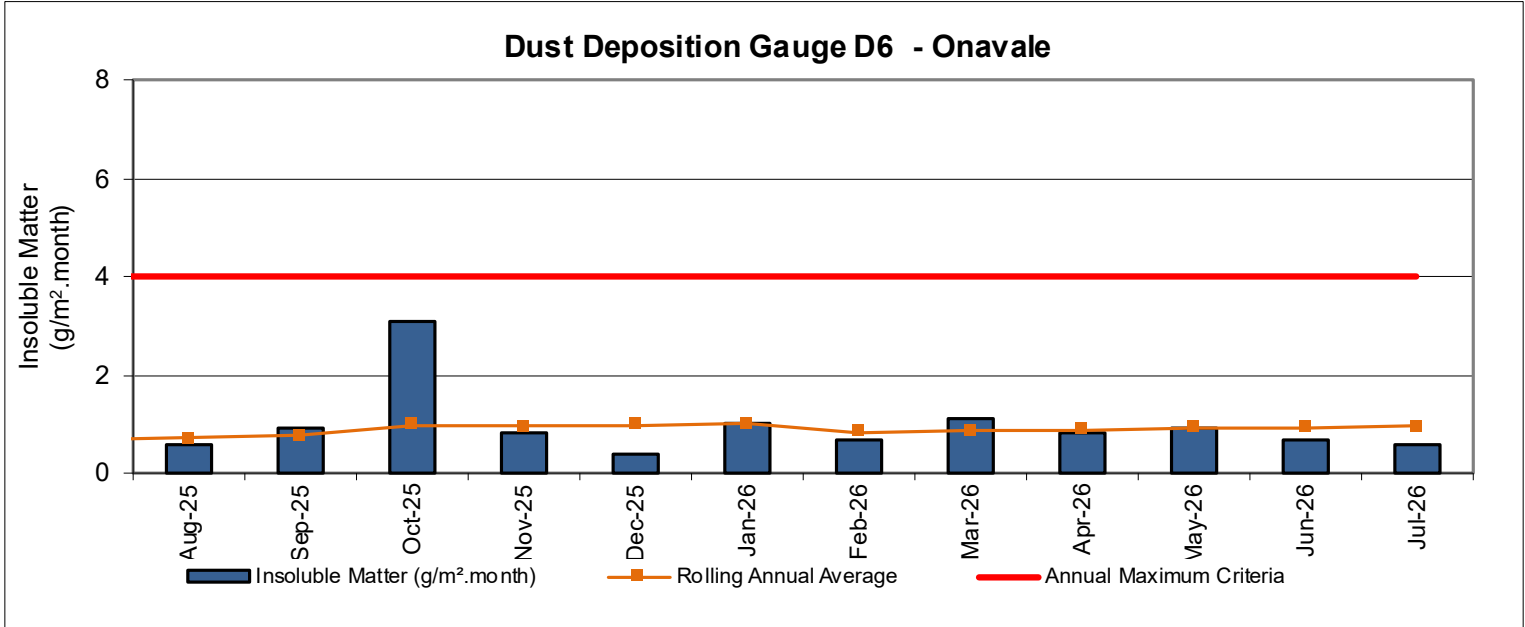
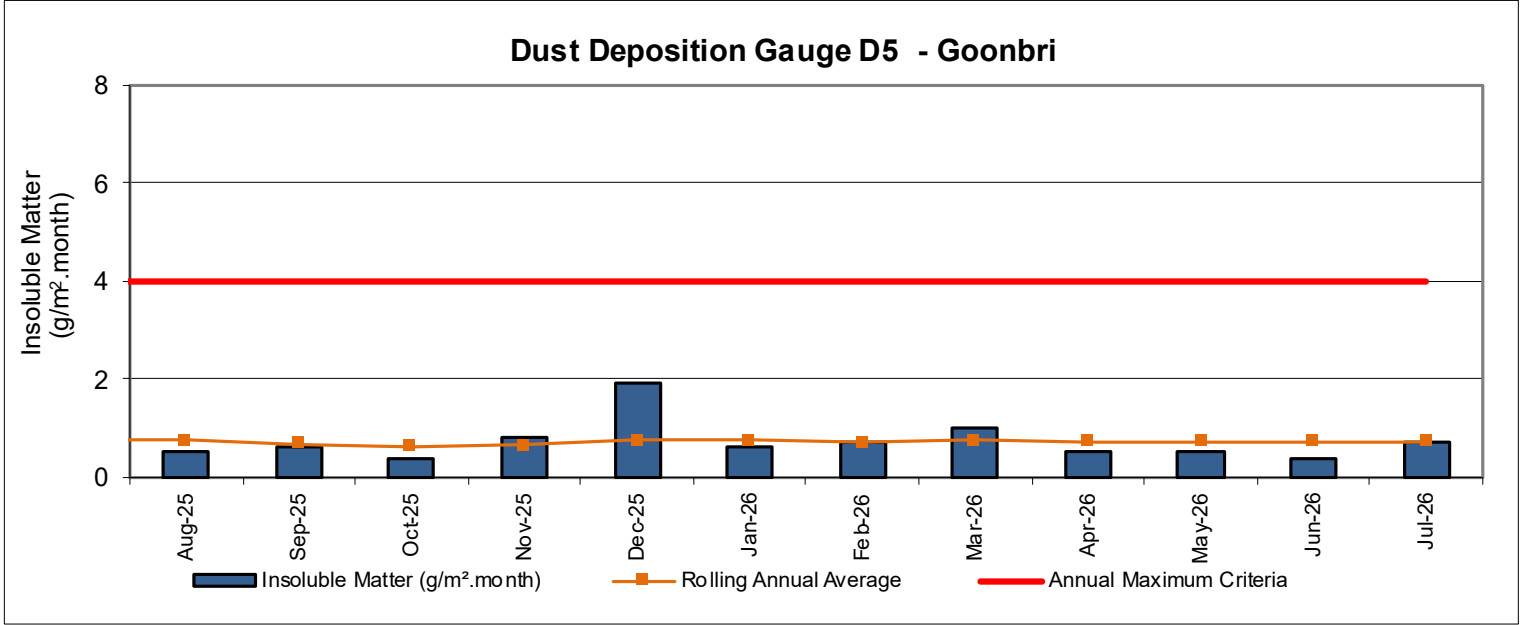
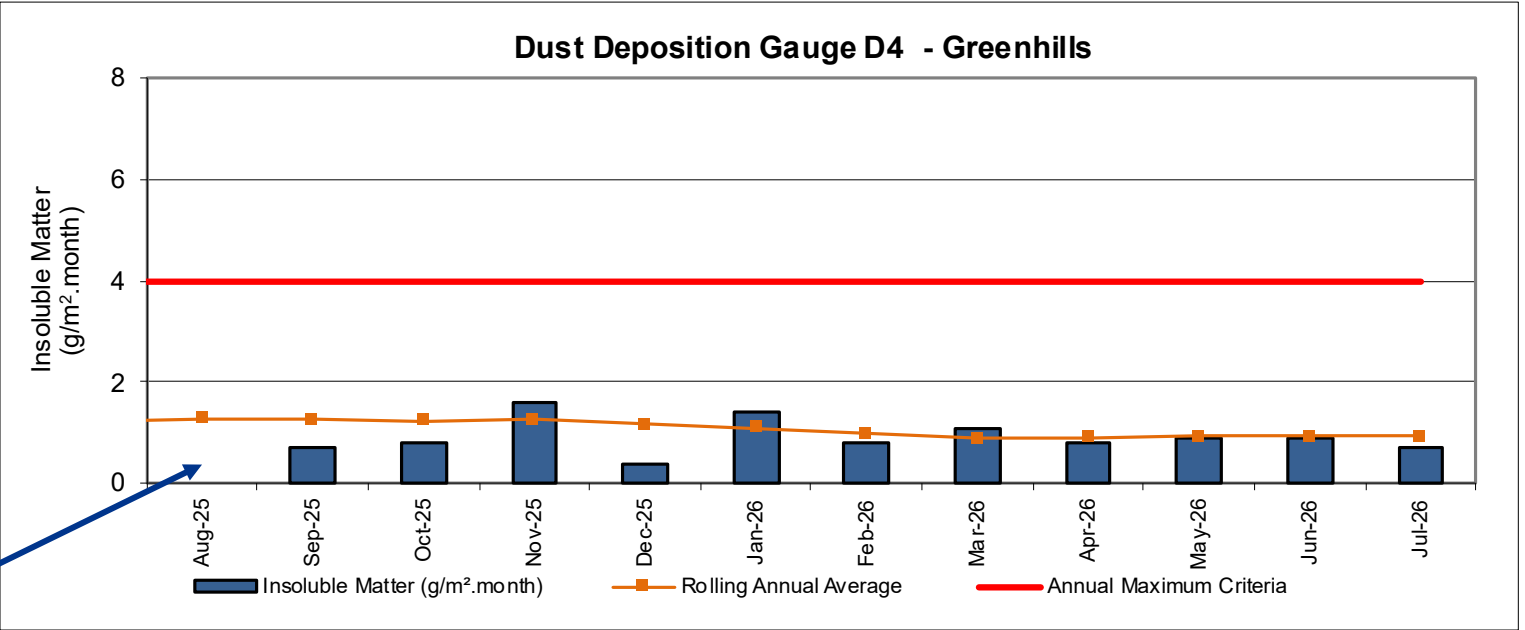


Figure 7: Wilberoi East PM_{2.5} previous 12-month 24hr averages and annual YTD average

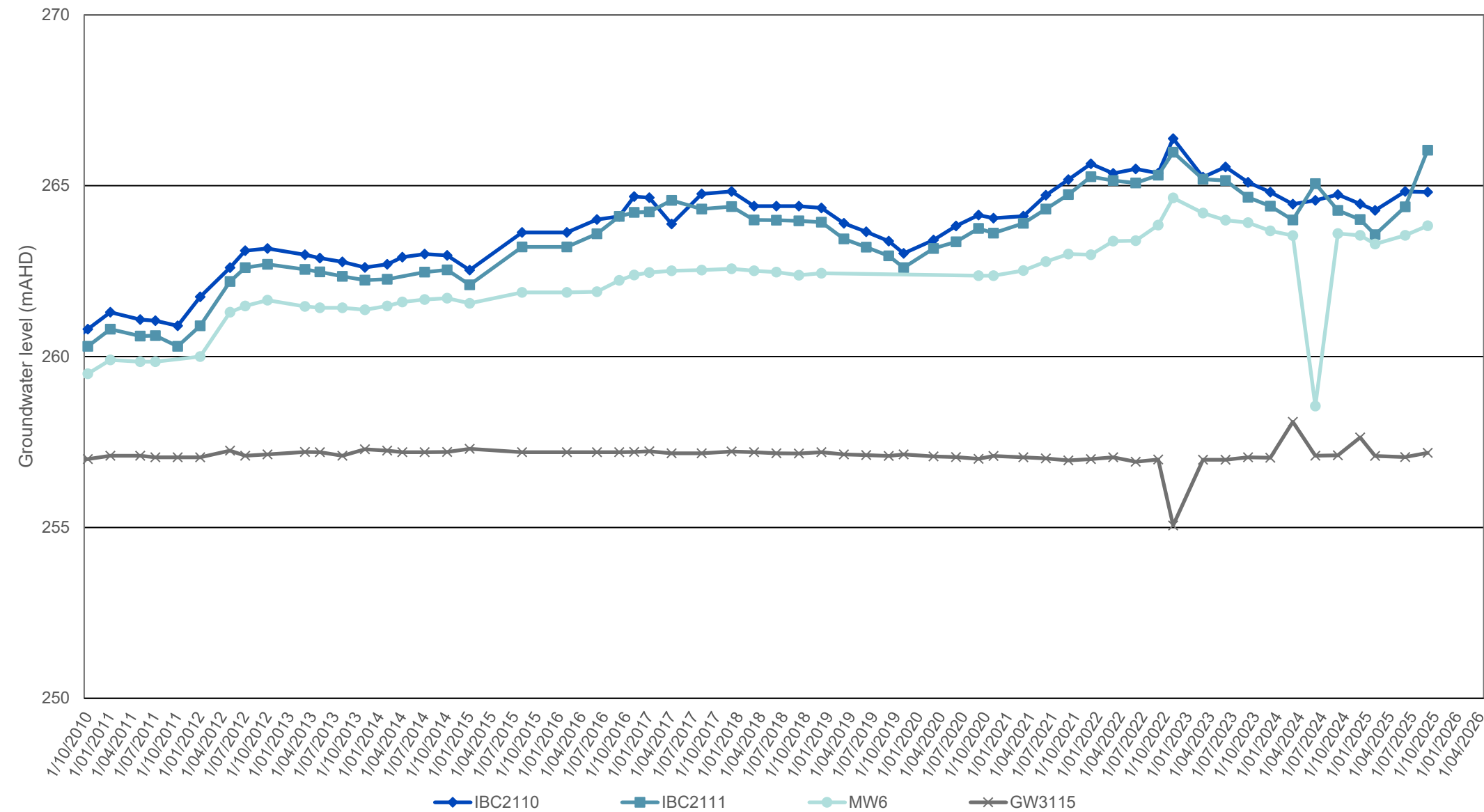

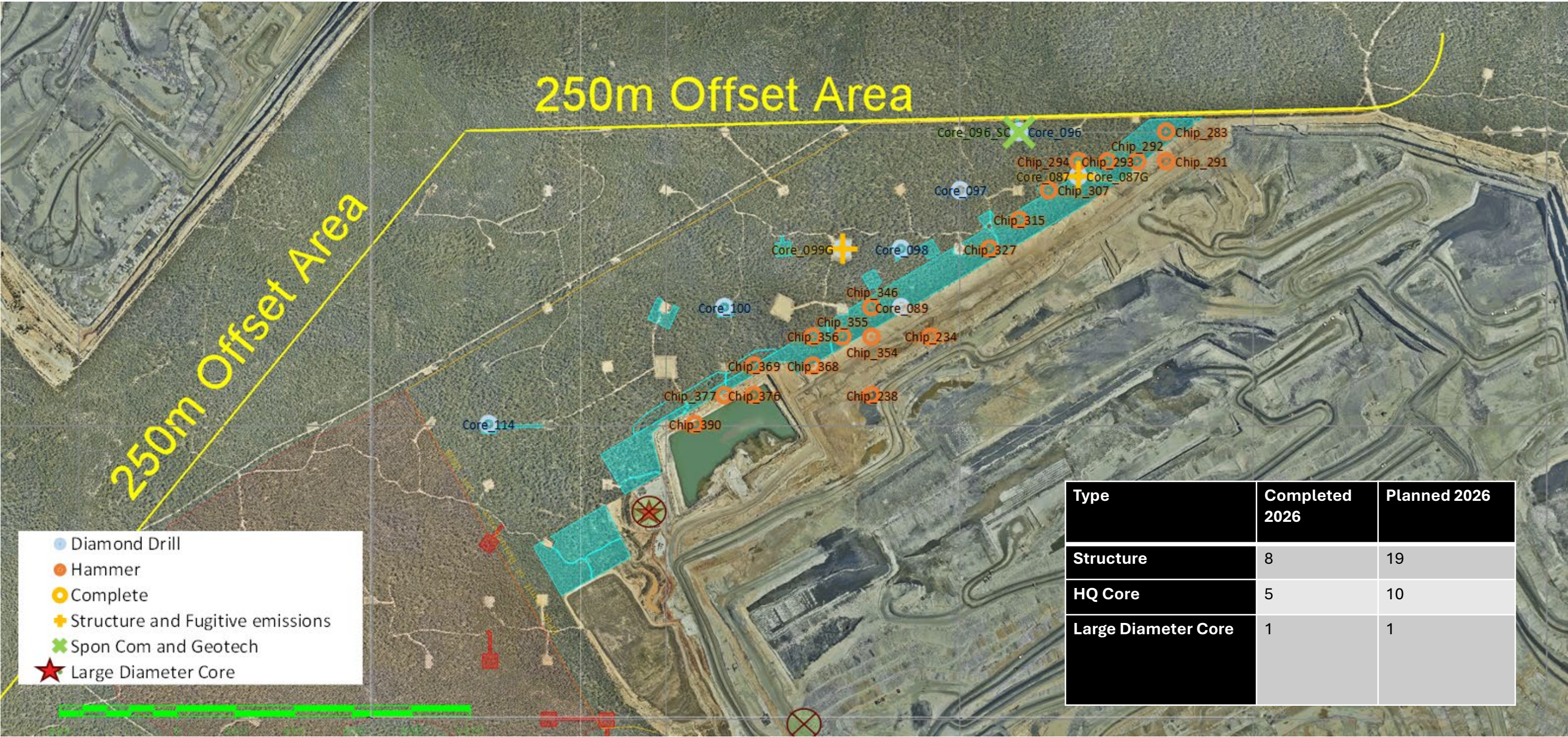

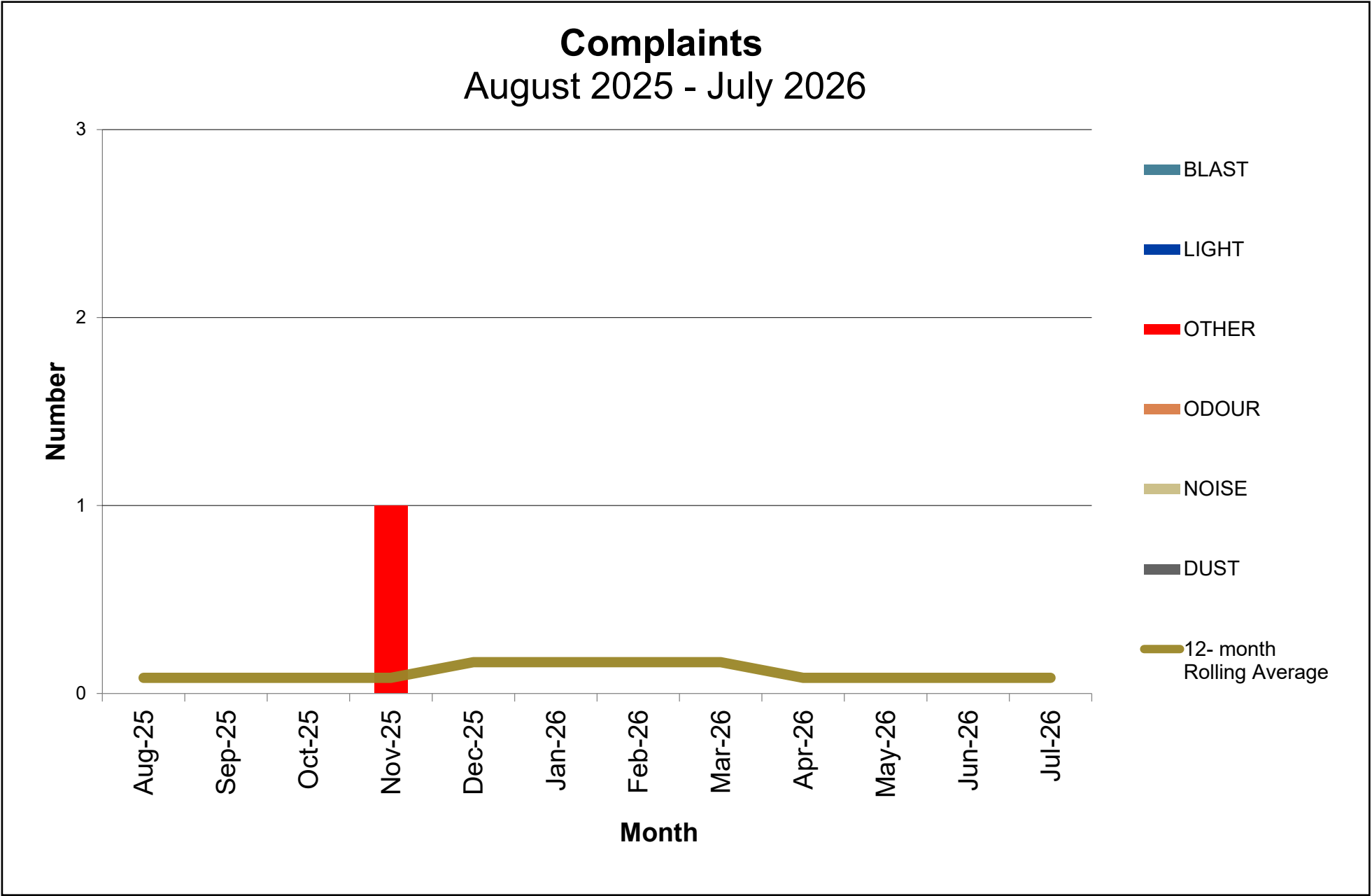
