

Minutes: Minutes of the meeting of the Boggabri Coal Community Consultative Committee held on Thursday 4 September 2025 at the Boggabri Golf Club commencing at 9.09 am.

1.	Welcome, Introductions and Apologies – MJS welcomed everyone to the meeting.	
2.	Acknowledgement of Country - The Chair acknowledged the Traditional Owners of the land on which the meeting is being held and their continuing connection to land, water, and culture, paying respects to their Elders past, present and emerging and any Aboriginal person present at the meeting.	
3.	Declaration of pecuniary or other interests - MJS advised his expenses are borne by the Proponent.	
4.	Minutes of the previous meeting – The minutes of the meeting of 15 May 2025 were approved on 4 July 2025. EOH noted that Action 5.1 should read “provide hard copies of survey document Updated Water Management Plan, Surface Water Management Plan, Groundwater Management Plan, Site Water balance as required by approval of Mod 8 and required prior to deeper mining to the Maules Creek community. 2 digital copies also requested”. The Chair agreed to make the amendment – the documents were supplied.	
5.	Actions 5.1 AW to advise on membership of the Native Title liaison committee. Response: Ongoing – the Committee has not held a second meeting. AW will share details of the Liaison Committee Members if they agree to information being shared. 5.2 MJS to write to the Federal and NSW Government local members regarding in-pit HV tyre disposal. Response: Correspondence forwarded to the Member for Parkes, Jamie Chaffey MP and the Member for Barwon, Roy	

	Butler MP. MJS read the content of the correspondence to the Federal and State Members to the Committee. 5.3 AW to confirm the proposed location of the Hunter Gas Pipeline on BCO offset properties. Response: Map provided in Proponent's Presentation. RD commented that there is a need for property names on the map to more accurately define the areas impacted. AW advised that the 'Blue' line represents the feed from the Pilliga gas field whilst the 'Purple/Red' line is the Hunter Gas Pipeline. AW indicated property names will be inserted on the map. 5.4 AW to provide a sectional coal seam profile graphic to CCC members. Response: Graphic Provided in Proponent's Presentation. AW advised that deepening part of the pit floor will allow access to lower coal reserves down to the Templemore Coal Seam. The Templemore Coal Seam is the lowest seam in the Maules Creek Coal Measures within this area. Recent flooding has delayed work to lower the pit floor to November 2025.	
6.	Correspondence 6.1 Outgoing • Jamie Chaffey MP – In-pit HV tyre disposal • Roy Butler MP – in-pit HV tyre disposal	
7.	Chair's Minute 7.1 Tree Clearing The Chair sought clarification on the information requested by RD in relation to tree clearing. MJS noted a level of confusion regarding the information requested and the documentation provided. He enquired of RD if the documentation provided addressed the information requested. She indicated it did but requested the genera of the animals impacted be included. It was noted that the document distributed at the October 2024 meeting was in draft and not formally approved. It was agreed that in future, the tree clearing report will be provided to theCCC, once finalised, preferably at its June meeting. RD observed it was essential to have this data to allow understanding of cumulative loss across the BTM precinct.	
8.	Proponent's Report <i>A copy of the Proponent's Report is attached to the minutes.</i> Correspondence AW stepped the Committee through the list of correspondence, highlighting the more significant matters. • NSW Department of Planning Housing and infrastructure (DPHI) AW stepped the committee through matters raised by the Department particularly in relation to the Groundwater Management Plan. EOH asked what type of information the Department requested? AW indicated that they related to currency and relevancy of work approvals and Groundwater Dependent Ecosystems (GDE's).	

AW advised that a penalty notice had been issued with an Official Caution for the over extraction of coal during the 2024 Calendar year.

- **Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water**

AW advised the Committee that Boggabri Coal had received advice from the Department for extraction from Victoria Park and Coobooobindi bores.

- **Environment Protection Authority (EPA)**

AW advised that the monthly attended noise monitoring reports had been submitted to the EPA.

AW noted that a variation to Boggabri Coal's Environmental Protection Licence had been approved to bury 400 end-of-life mine tyres for each annual return period until 2027. EOH questioned what will happen to the 200 historical tyres? AW responded that the 200 legacy tyres will be buried in-pit over the next two annual reporting periods. The 200 tyres had been used as bund around the maintenance laydown area since 2014, all tyres were large mining tyres. During an insurance audit a concern was raised with the layout of the tyres, consequently the tyre bund is being replaced with an earthen bund.

AW advised that a Request for Further Information (RFI) had been received from the EPA for the blast exceedance recorded on 18 January 2025. AW also indicated that a notification was forwarded to the EPA in respect of missed sampling events in August due to flooding.

- **Biodiversity Conservation Trust**

AW confirmed that all conservation agreements had been registered on land titles.

- **National Parks**

AW confirmed that draft deed agreements for land transfer are being prepared and are expected to be finalised by the end of 2025.

- **Forestry Corporation of NSW**

AW reported that the forestry permit and Exclusive Use Agreement had been executed.

- **Department of Climate Change, Energy, Environment and Water**

AW advised that a notification was sent to the Department regarding the submission of the Water Management Plan, Groundwater Management Plan, Surface Water Management Plan and Site Water Balance. Further that, a notification was sent on 30 May 2025 to the Department regarding the commencement of mining below the Merriown Coal Seam was forwarded.

- **Narrabri Shire Council**
- AW reported that a meeting was held with Narrabri Shire Council regarding the long-term plan for the housing commitment.
- **NSW Natural Resources Access Regulator**
AW advised that all required reports for the period had been submitted to the Regulator including the final Cultural Consultation Report.
- **Native Title**
AW advised there has been no progress on holding a second Liaison Committee meeting.
- **Management Plan Revisions**
AW reported on the revision of various management plans including water management plans and strategies which has involved correspondence with DPHI for various amendments. RD questioned what were the amendments? AW responded that the adjustments related to adding more informative descriptions and general clarifications in some areas.

Operational Update – YTD

- **Production Targets**
It was noted that 4.2 million tonnes had been mined to date in 2025.

AW outlined the key projects for 2025:

- Finalise edge of pit maintenance and fuel facility.
- Expansion of workshop and warehouse.
- Development Project impact assessments.
- Solar Farm commissioning.
- Glentarkie construction
- Relocation of main mine water dam.

Modification 10 update

AW stepped the committee through the planning process associated with Modification 10. She advised that 58 submissions had been received and a Response to Submissions (RTS) is currently being prepared. Sixteen objections, two comment only submissions plus agency advice were received with the remaining submissions in support of the project.

AW advised the Committee that the Conservation Programs, Heritage & Regulation Group (CPHR) noted in its submission to MOD10 that WSP had provided misleading information. However, this information was provided after WSP's calculator had been found to contain a multiplication error. It should be noted that WSP did not provide

misleading information within the MOD10 assessment report.

EOH commented that DPHI usually provides a list of summary issues raised in the submissions. She noted that this list is no longer provided. AW explained the RTS process to be followed, as detailed in the presentation. RD enquired whether each issue raised in a submission is addressed in the RTS. AW advised that each issue is summarised, and a response is provided in the RTS.

Housing Voluntary Planning Agreement Update

AW provided an update on the completion of the Glentarkie dwellings in August 2025 and discussions with Narrabri Shire Council on housing for doctors in Boggabri.

2024/25 Water Year Take Volumes

The committee noted the graphs and tables relating to the water take volumes, rainfall and water storage.

2025 HV tyre disposal

SP advised that 171 large mining tyres have been disposed of in-pit to date this year. She indicated that BCO intends to undertake more recycling by the end of 2025. Tyres with a radius of 51 inches and below will be recycled for the next two years. EOH noted the small number of tyres which had been recycled so far in 2025. SP indicated more would be recycled and explained the tyres cannot be recycled if they are still in use. RD asked why only tyres with a smaller radius are being recycled, SP explained the costs associated with recycling larger tyres prevents their recycling at this stage.

Exploration 2025

AW advised that the exploration processed had been significantly impacted by wet weather but is ongoing.

Rehab Progression 2023 – 2025

The Committee reviewed the rehabilitation progression photographs in the presentation. RD enquired where the rehabilitation is occurring? SP advised that it is at the rear of the mine and along the eastern boundary.

Sponsorship 2025

It was noted that \$216,506 had been provided in sponsorship to 40 organisations or events to date in 2025.

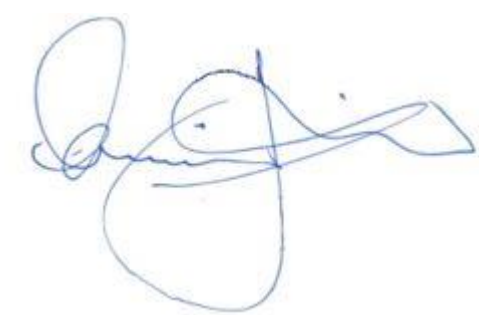
Current Vacancies

The Committee noted the current list of vacancies. EOH enquired as to the reasons for the vacancies. AW responded that it was very competitive attracting staff particularly from the Hunter Valley, where proximity to the coast and other attractions were important lifestyle considerations. AW added that trade staff are often transient.

	Environmental Monitoring • Noise Monitoring The Committee noted the noise monitoring tables. • Air Quality Monitoring The Committee examined the Air Quality Monitoring tables. It noted the various exceedances and the commentary in respect of each. RD highlighted the gap in the data from the monitors at Wilberoi East from 23 January to 3 February 2025, due to a power outage and sought advice on the cause. AW indicated that the monitors had been struck by lightning. • Groundwater Monitoring The Committee reviewed the Ground Water monitoring graph. RD highlighted a large dip in the MW6 during July 2024 and a decline in GW3115 during January 2023. AW indicated she would examine the reasons for these variations. <i>Proponents Response: The small spikes observed in MW6 & GW3115 we're outliers in sampling and recovered by the next sampling event. GW3115 has had historically stable groundwater levels and since 2022 have increased in some results. MW6 groundwater levels have historically responded to periods of above or below average rainfall and has recovered and remained steady since the July 2024 reading. Both readings were isolated spikes, and ongoing monitoring will be undertaken to identify any trends or future exceedances of criteria.</i>	ACTION: AW to provide reasons for the dips in the Groundwater Monitoring graphs for MW6 (July 2024) and GW3115 (January 2023)
9.	Other Agenda Items Nil	
10.	General Business 10.1 Modification 10 EOH understood that Modification 10 was lodged in June 2025. She enquired as to why it has taken less time to finalise and lodge. AW responded that it was lodged in the timeframe originally proposed and then subsequently exhibited by DPHI. EOH commented that it seemed to happen very quickly especially given the water management issues that had to be addressed in MOD 8 before MOD 10 could be activated. AW questioned whether EOH was disputing a State Government imposed timeframe and advised that the condition from both Federal and State authorities in respect of MOD 8 “groundwater issues” was the installation of four monitoring bores before coal was mined from the Merriown Seam. Discussion proceeded on the MOD 8 process and timing. AW indicated the proposal to mine deeper (MOD 8) was lodged in 2021. She also noted the area that will be mined has been reduced due to the time it took the State and Federal Governments to approve MOD8.	

	MJS advised that a submission to MOD 10 in relation to developer contributions had been lodged by the Leard Forest Precinct Environmental Trust. Meeting closed 10.30 am

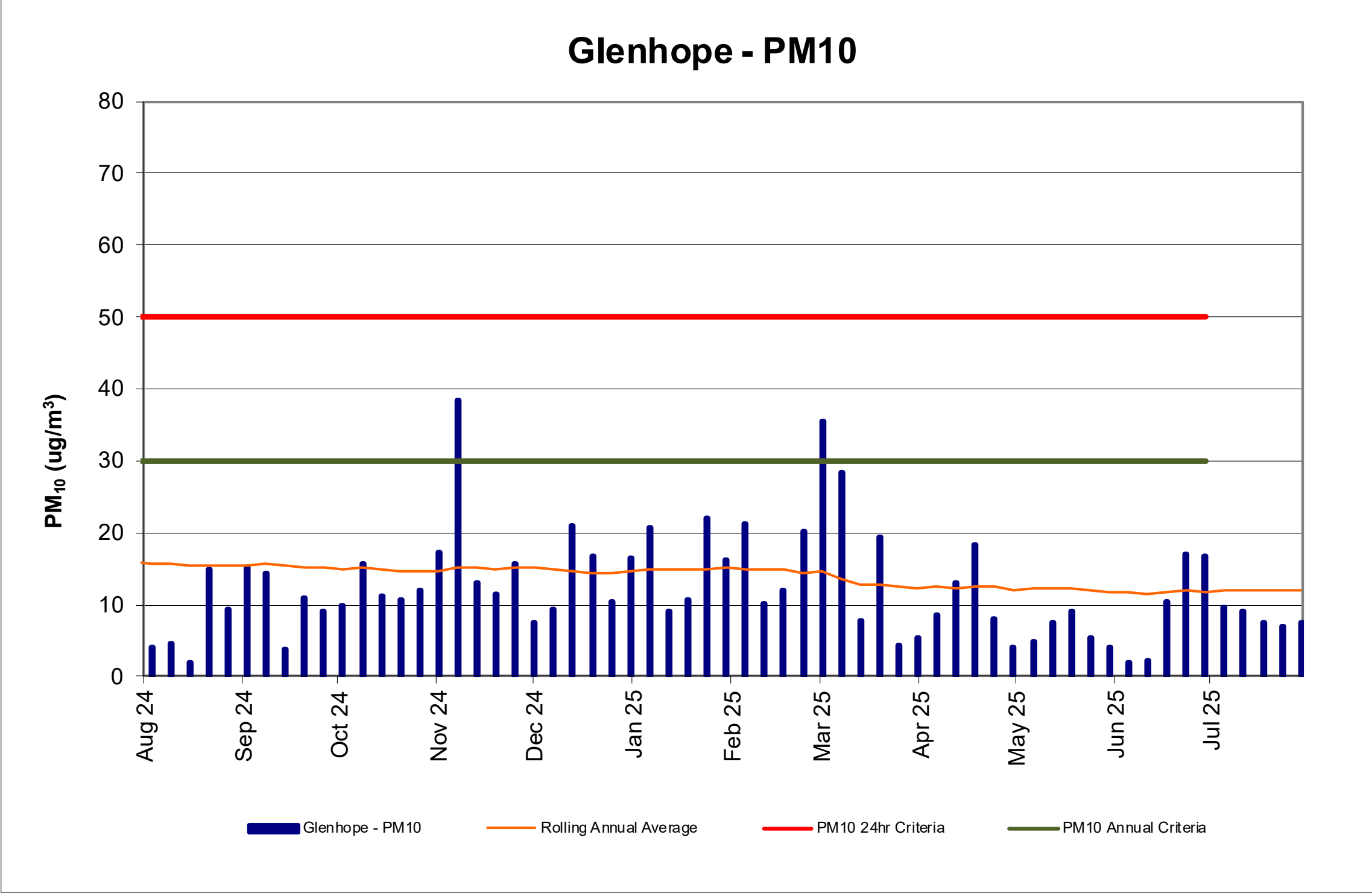

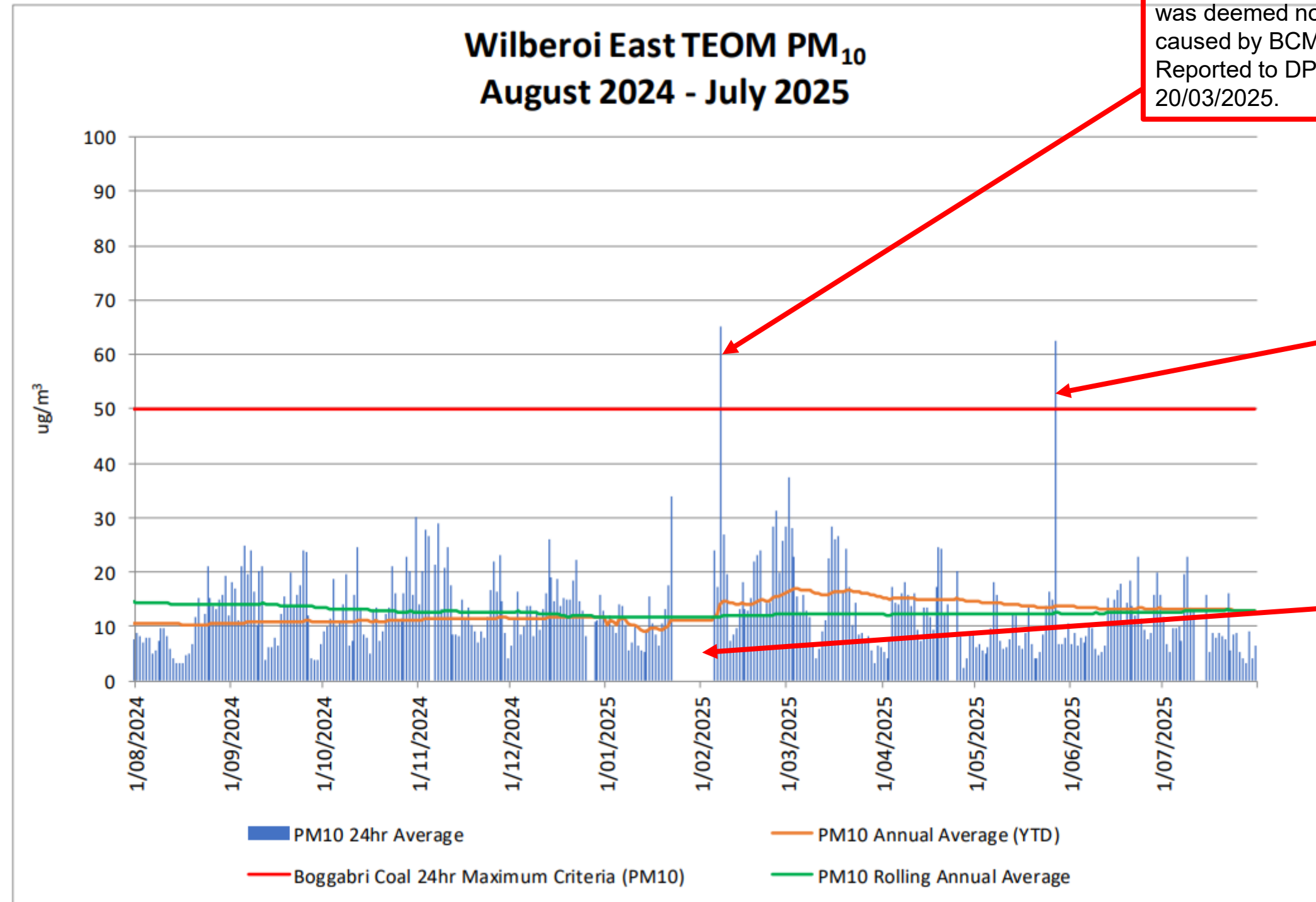

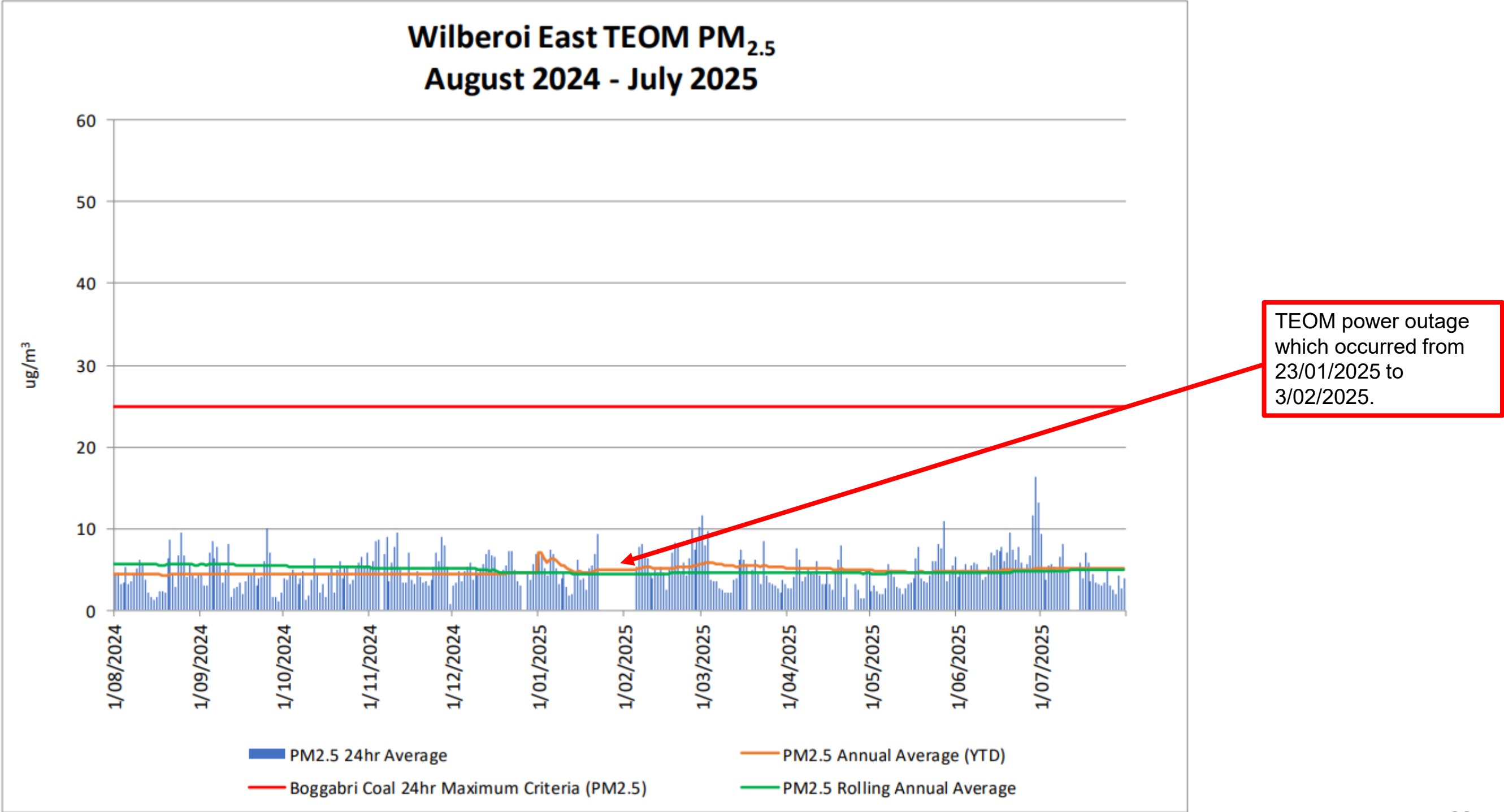

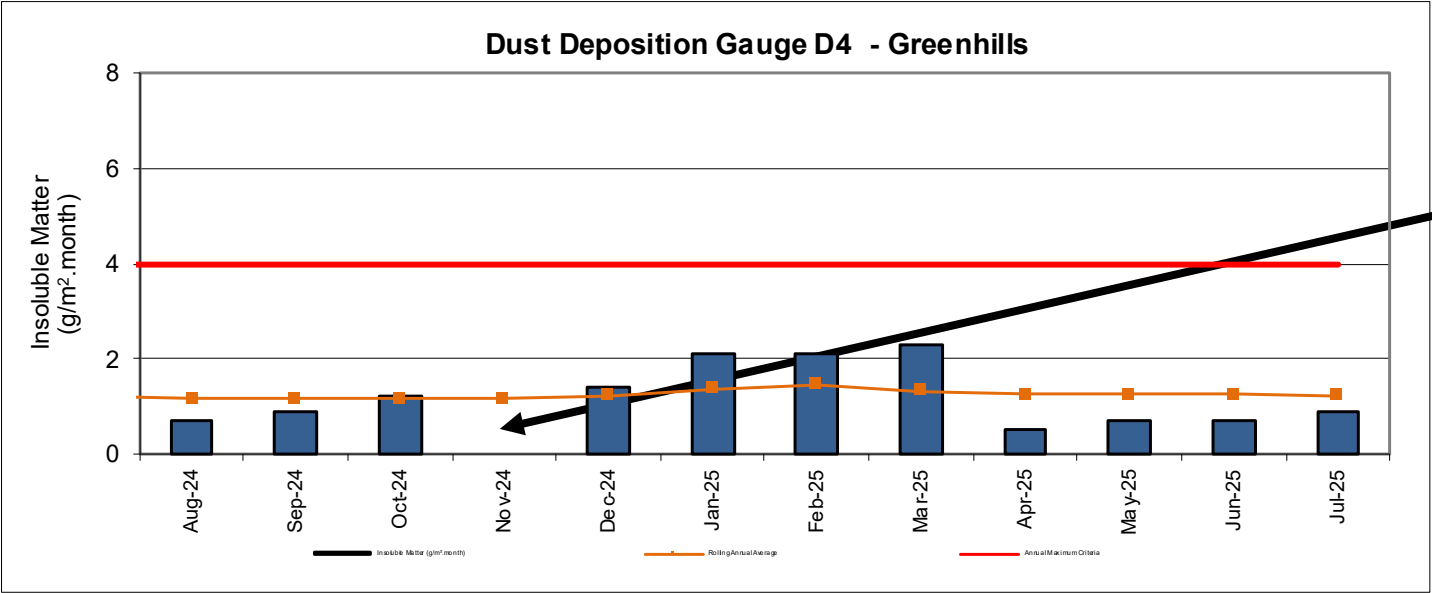

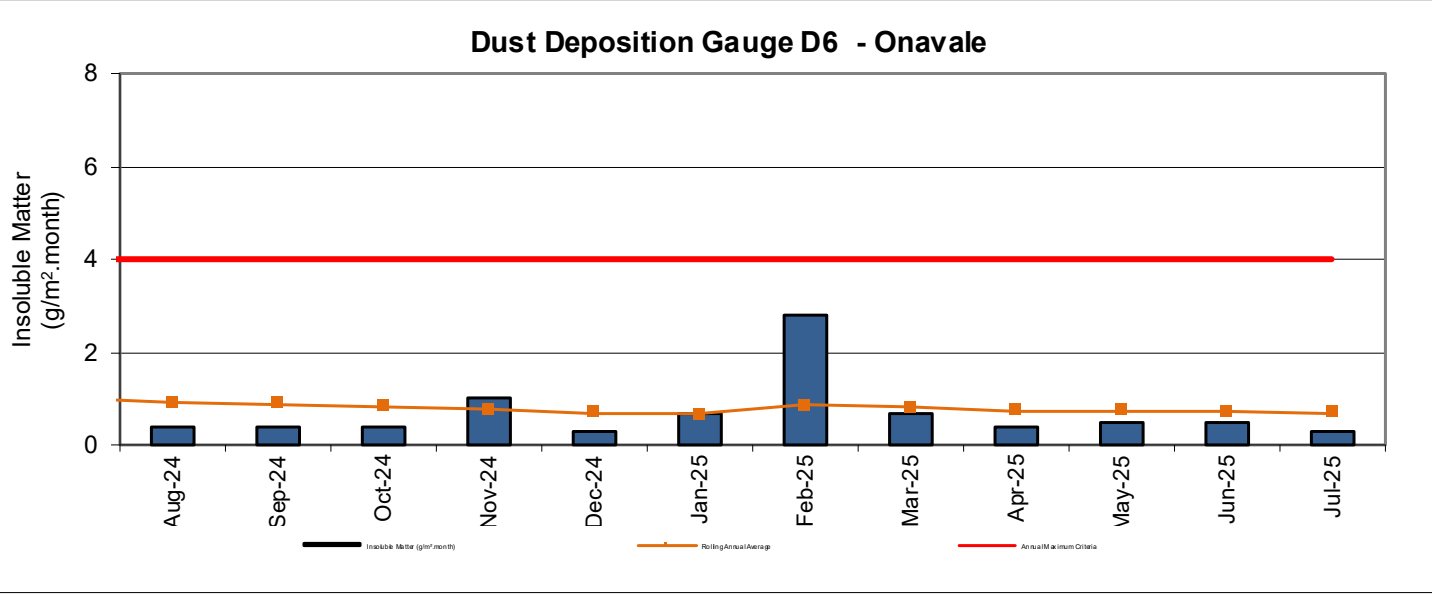
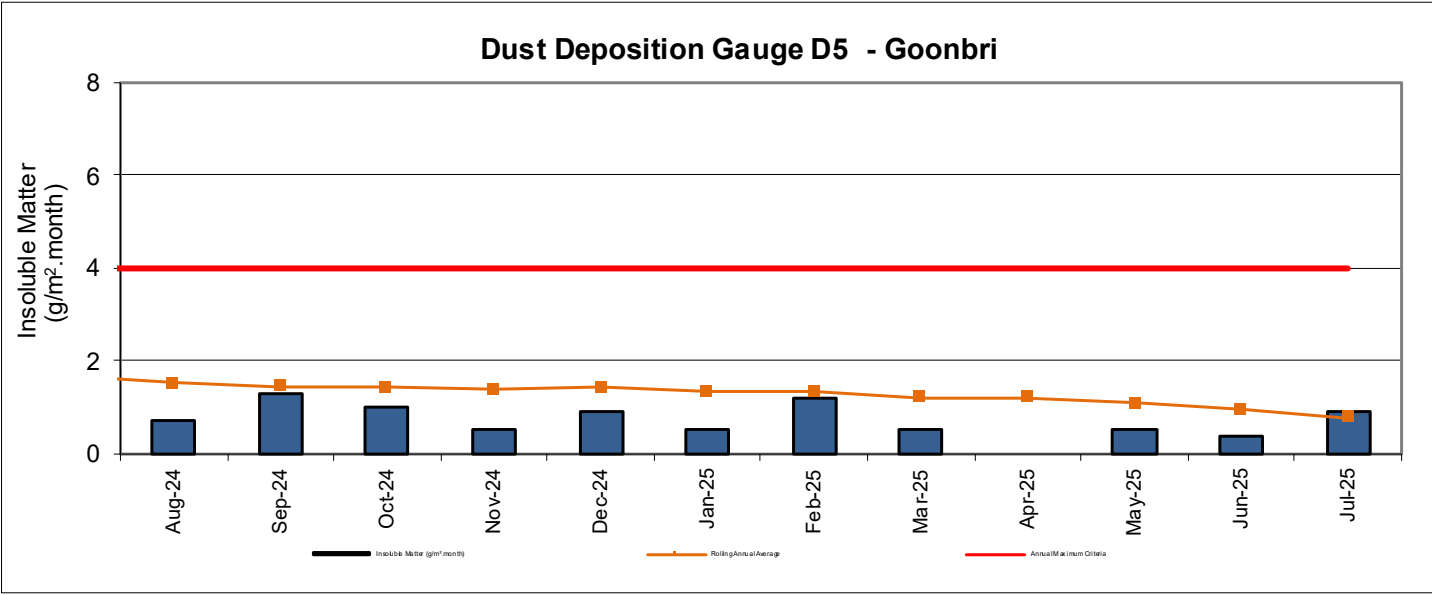
Air Quality TEOM PM2.5 Wilberoi East

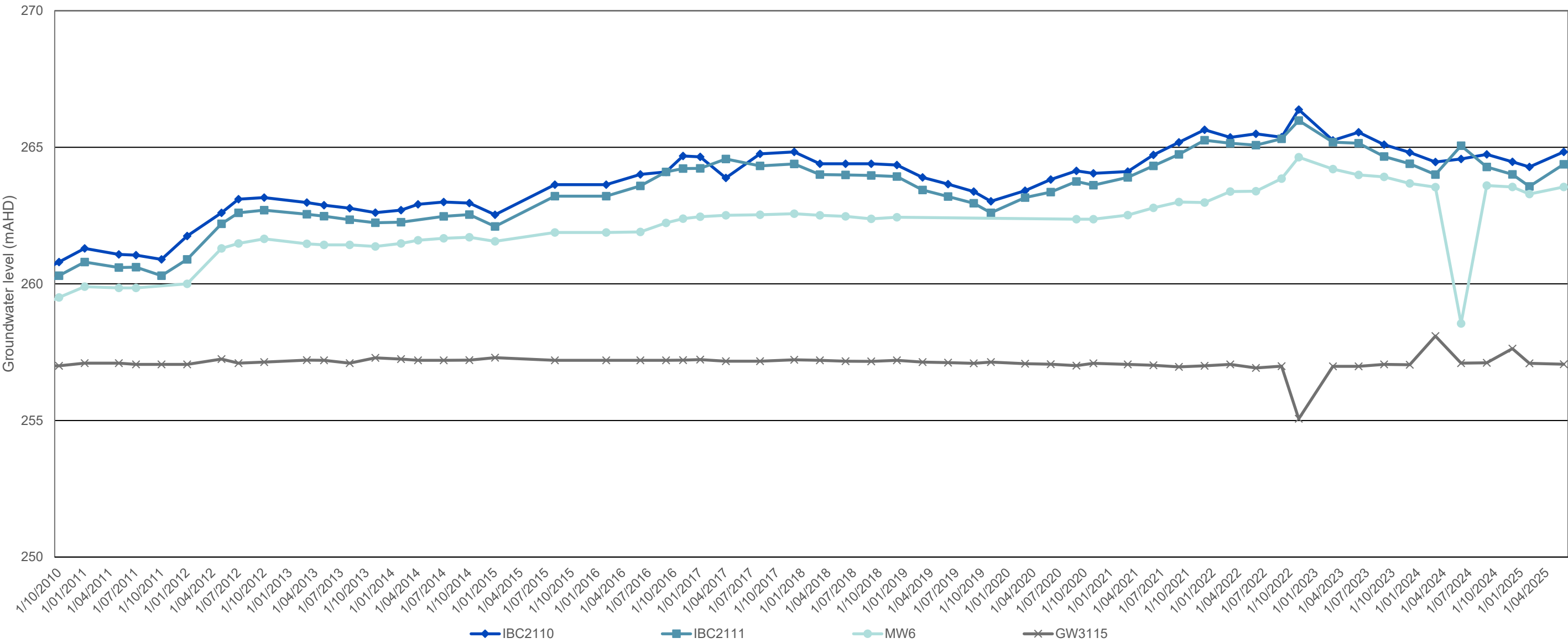

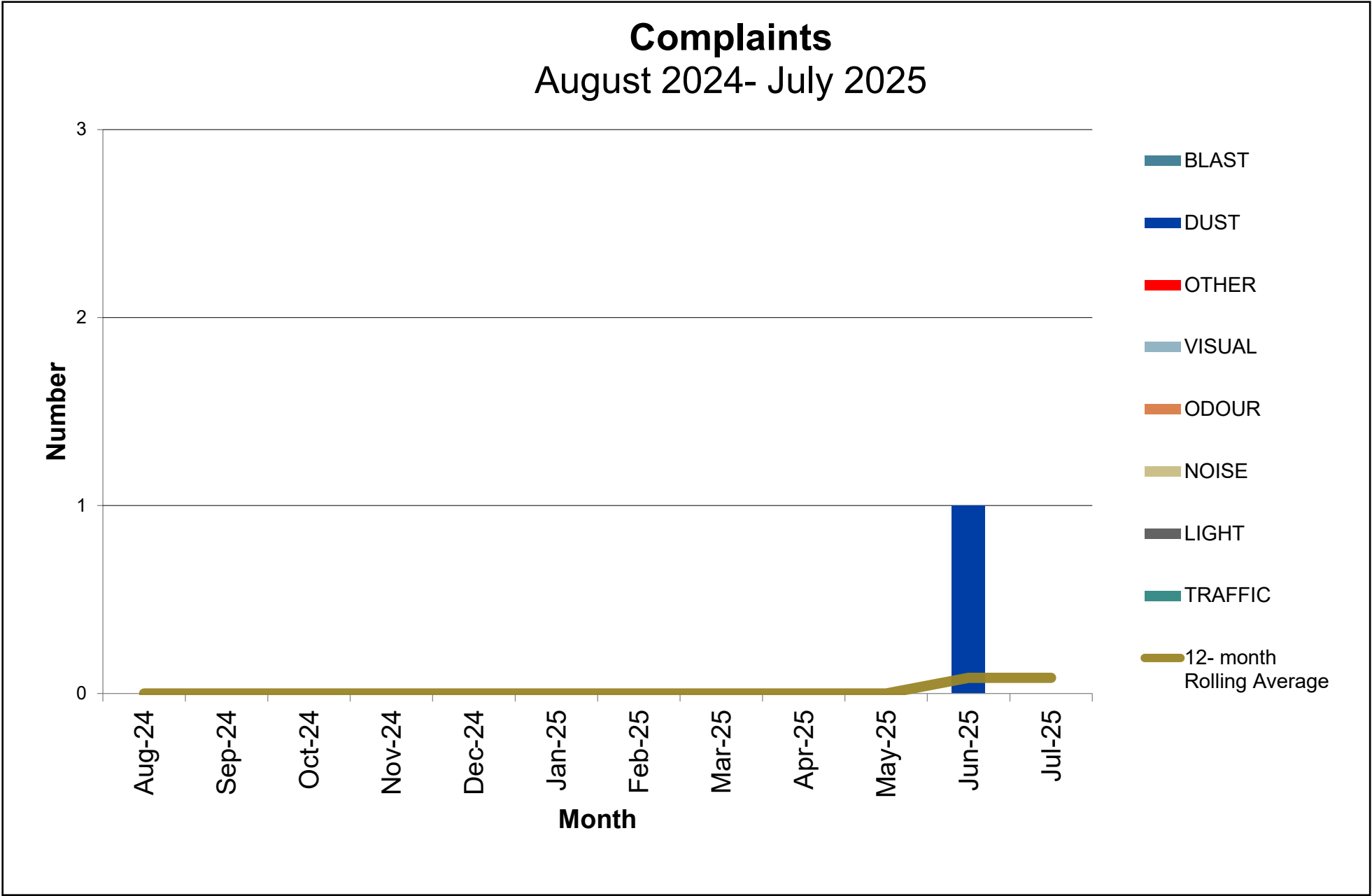
