	supply in water storage infrastructure. Mine water is

	<ul> <li>CD – in fact, the long-term average is below 20μg/m³.</li> </ul>	
	Please note that this monitoring station is used for	
	management response and not for compliance.	
	CD – The Merriown PM10 monitoring results are used	
	for compliance, as per EPL 12407. Results from this	
	high Volume Sampler (located approximately 1 km	
	from the mine site) have the long term average PM10 levels at less than 15 μg/m <sup>3</sup> .	
	<ul> <li>JR - Monitoring of all blasting activities within the last 3 months has shown zero exceedance of noise and</li> </ul>	
	vibration criteria.	
	CD – BCPL continue to monitor all blasts for NOx fumes	
	JT – Asked for any further questions.  JR 16 thous is no expendence and it is still viewally due to	
	<ul> <li>JP- If there is no exceedence and it is still visually dusty what can be done?</li> </ul>	
	CD – Visual dust observations are made by trained	
	personnel at the dispatch hut (overlooking operations)	
	& the Supervisors/OCE's - they are responsible for day-	
	to-day management of environmental factors	
	including dust, noise, light, etc. These personnel may	
	choose to alter operations (operating at a lower RL or	
	closing an operation down) and will record such	
	alterations on the daily operations register. This	
	information is then used to track an operations	
	response to adverse weather conditions.	
	JT – Asked for any further questions.	
6 Community	Complaints for 2014 YTD are attached in the BCCC	
Complaints	presentation.	
Complaints	RD – I would like to register a complaint concerning a	
	blast from BCM on the morning of the 27 <sup>th</sup> of June	
	2014, that resulted in a visible fume. The blast was	
	scheduled for 3:00pm on the 27 <sup>th</sup> of June, can you	
	please advise why BCM conducted an unscheduled	
	blast and why the community was not notified?	
	RD – produced a photograph that she claims is of the	
	blast fume, with a time and date stamp.	
	CD – BCPL is unaware of any unscheduled blast events	
	associated with the operation of the Boggabri Coal	
	Mine.	
	LH – requested a copy of the photograph	





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	<ul> <li>RD – agreed to forward a copy via email</li> <li>LH – advised that the BCM had a blast scheduled for 3:00pm on the 27<sup>th</sup> of July 2014, which he can personally confirm was conducted on schedule as he and several other BCPL employees were blast guards on Leard Forest Road.</li> <li>LH – agreed to confirm this in writing to RD</li> <li>RD – The community is stressed about the traffic utilising Harprary Road for access to the mine site.</li> <li>CD – BCPL regularly PSI's all staff and contractors about the designated access to the mine site.</li> <li>RD – what about mine security?</li> <li>LH – BCPL believes that security used by mining companies within the Leard State Forest precinct is well within their rights to utilise the existing local road network to ensure the safe and continued operation of the mine. Has there been a specific incident in regards to the security?</li> <li>RD – No specific incidents to report, but the community is still very stressed following the ongoing operations from the security companies and the police.</li> <li>RG – advised that he has had nothing but positive experiences with the police and security companies.</li> </ul>	
7 Environmental Trust Fund (ETF)	<ul> <li>JT – community representatives from each mine have now been selected. JT to work with the mine to nominate a representative from each.</li> <li>JT – NSC have agreed to administer the fund, for an administration fee.</li> </ul>	
10 General Business/ questions	<ul> <li>RG – questioned the schedule for construction traffic, when is the mine expecting to see a decrease in traffic accessing the mine site.</li> <li>CD – the majority of construction activities are scheduled for completion in Q2 2015. BCPL would expect to see some traffic reduction by Q1 2015.</li> </ul>
